

Head-on collision

Two cars collided head-on at Maple Ave. in Georgetown Feb 7 at 5:20 p.m. No one was injured in the accident, but both cars were severely damaged. A 1983 Plymouth was eastbound on Maple Ave. when it struck a 1988 Toyota which was westbound on the same road, police said. The Toyota was turning left, and the driver, a Rockwood resident, was charged with making an improper left turn.

Steering defect

A car was heading east on Sargent Rd. in Georgetown Feb. 9 at 1:20 p.m. when it veered to the right and struck a parked car, police said. The owner of the wayward car, a 1984 Chevrolet, complained of a mechanical defect in the steering, police said.

Trial date still to be set

A date has not yet been set for the trial of Guelph resident who faces three charges in relation to a head-on collision March 5, 1991 in which Guelph resident Benjamin Jagger was killed. A preliminary hearing was held in Milton Feb. 6, in which the court decided there was enough evidence to proceed with a trial, police said. The accident was on the Guelph Line, north of 15 Sdrd. The man has pleaded not guilty to dangerous driving causing death, impaired driving causing death and driving with over 80 mg of alcohol in his blood.

Store robbery

Police have several leads on a man suspected of robbing the Mac's Convenience Store on Guelph St. in

Georgetown Thursday at 11:30 p.m. A man with black on his face entered the store and told the clerk that this was a stick up, Halton police said. The clerk didn't believe him at first, but when he went behind the counter, she realized he was serious. The man hid his hand by tucking it behind his coat, as if he had a weapon. He took \$240 from the till and left the store, walking slowly, police said. The clerk tried to dial 911, but the phone line was dead, so she locked the door of the store and used the pay phone. The man was wearing a red baseball cap with white writing on it at the time of the robbery.

Wire stolen

A spool of copper wire weighing 200 lbs was stolen over the weekend from the construction site at Maple and Main Streets in Georgetown. Someone cut the chain using belt cutters on the premises and went inside the building. The wire is valued at \$200 and the spool was three-quarters full of wire.

School break-in

Holy Cross School was broken into over the weekend, but nothing was stolen. A ground floor office window was broken, and the culprits were able to slide it open, police said. All the rooms were locked, so no property was taken, but the toilets in the boy's washroom were clogged with paper

towels. The investigation is continuing.

Trespassing at night

Three high school students were charged with trespassing at night after a woman heard them around her home at 1 a.m. The woman called 911, and when police arrived, they fled. A foot chase followed and one 18 year old and two 17 year olds were charged, police said.

Windows broken

An office on a subdivision site on Mountainview Rd. at Argill Rd. in Georgetown was vandalized. A window and a door of the trailer office were broken sometime overnight Wednesday, police said. The suspect may have been attempting to gain entry to the trailer.

Electrical equipment

Electrical equipment worth \$200 was taken from Credit River Boat Rentals in Norval. Five boats are stored on the premises. Someone entered by cutting a barbed wire fence, police said. They went into the backyard and removed the equipment from the boats.

Driver charged

A Georgetown driver was charged after an accident at Mill St. and Park Ave. Tuesday morning at 10:30 a.m. The car which hit a pole as well as a traffic sign was moderately damaged. A passenger was taken to Georgetown Hospital by ambulance where she was treated and released. The woman was charged with making an unsafe lane change and the passenger was charged with not wearing a seatbelt.

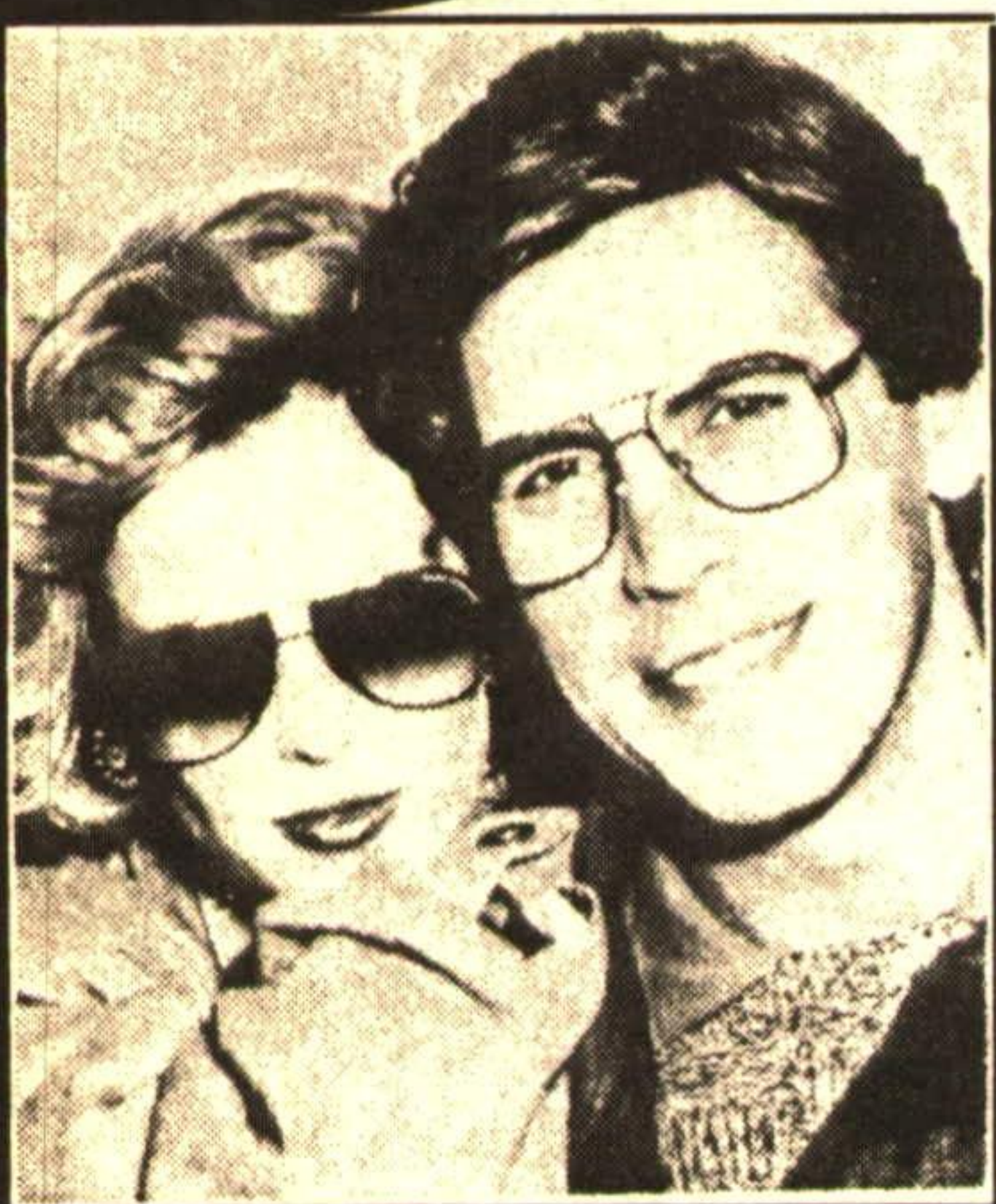
