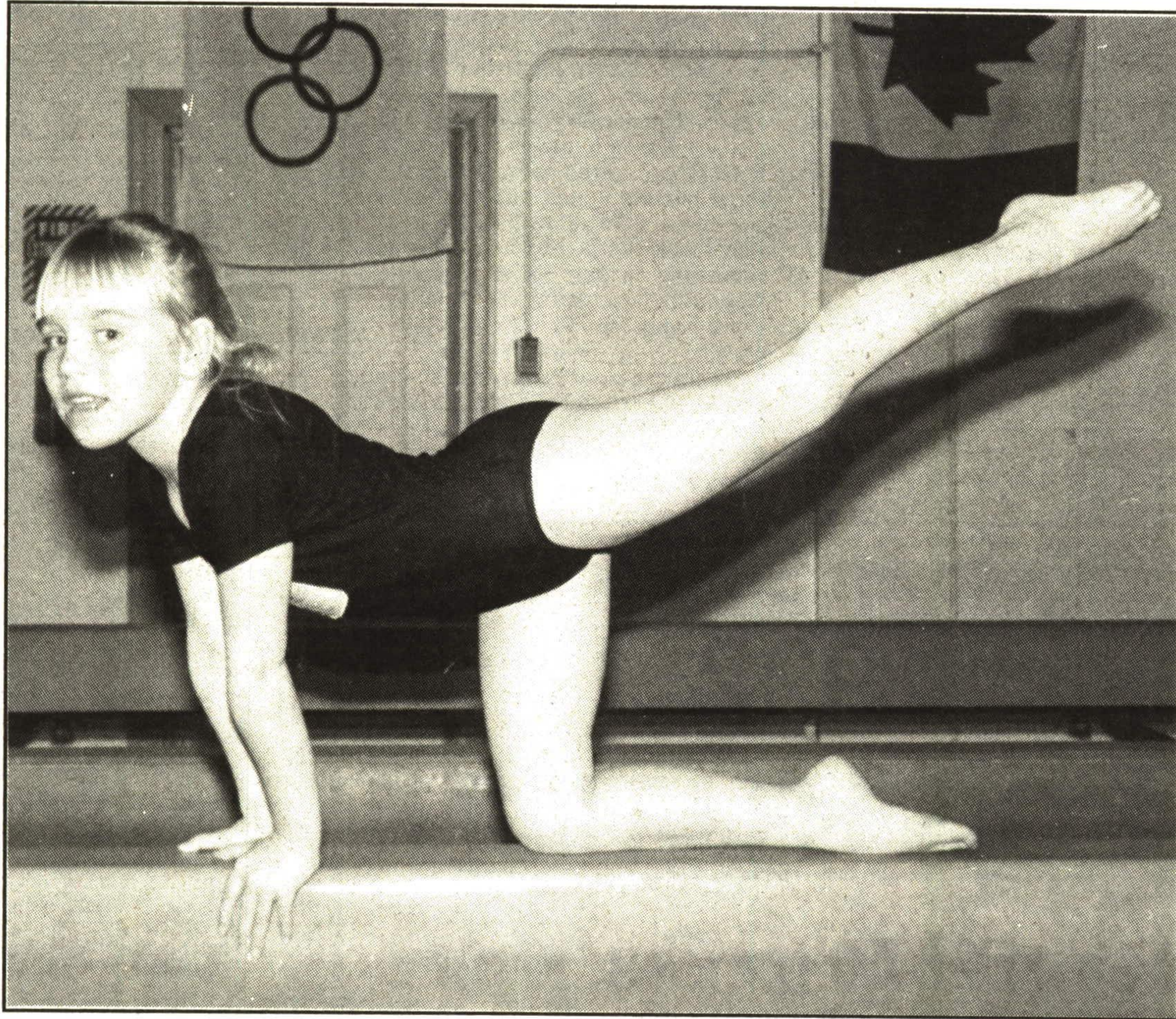

Sherratt claims basketball titles

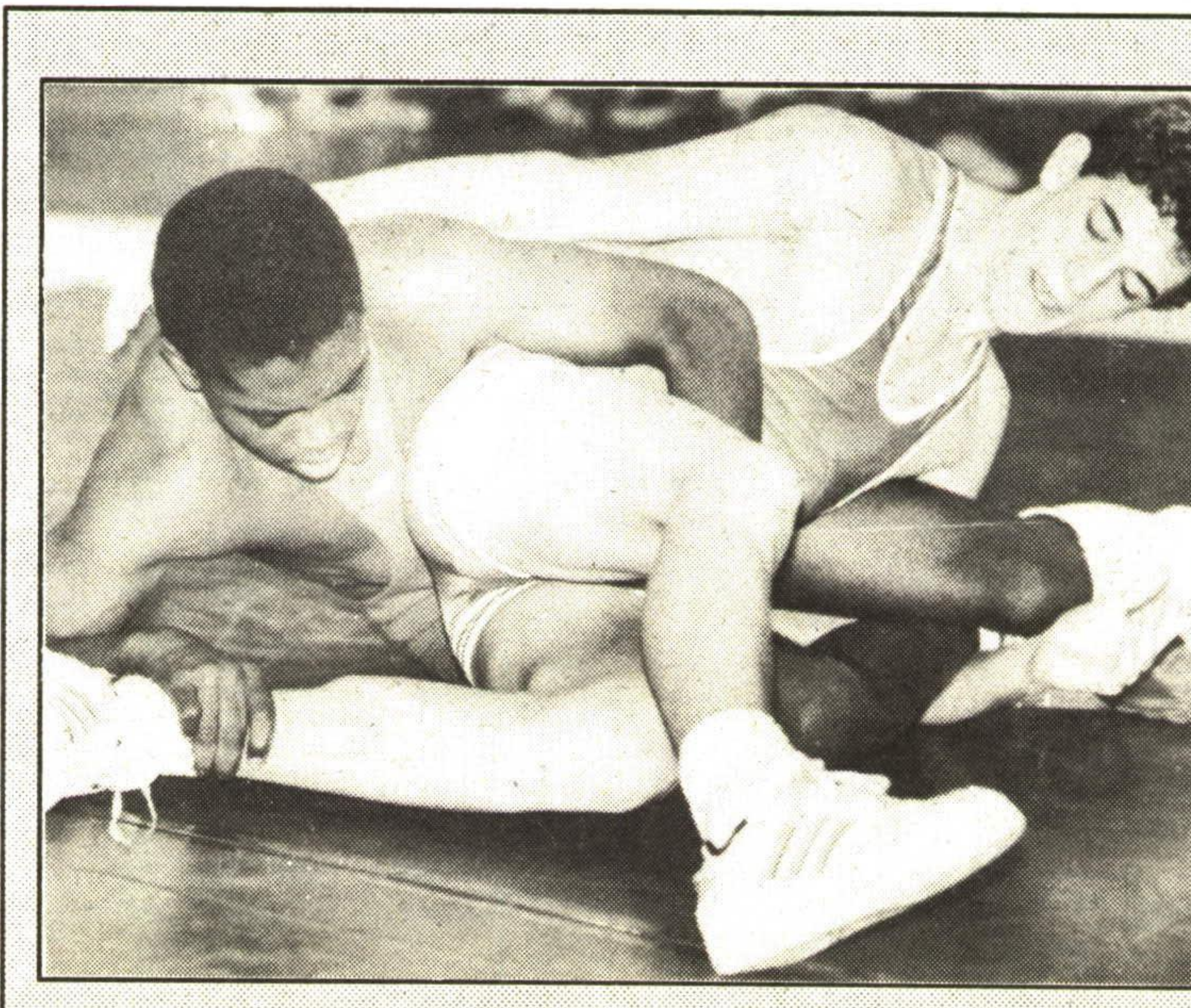
Sam Sherratt of Milton claimed both North Halton Public School basketball titles last week, but not before they had some anxious moments.
