Entries sought for sculpture contest

A special Canada-wide functional sculpture competition, supported by Vivian and David Campbell, was announced by the Art Gallery of Ontario. The two-stage competition is open to all practising professional artists, designers and architects who are Canadian citizens or landed immigrants.

Deadline date for submissions is May 1, 1992.

Functional sculpture for this competition may include original interpretations of seating, tables, lighting, various containers or other objects. Individually commissioned functional sculpture will be acquired as works of art for the

Gallery's permanent collection.

Professional artists, architects and designers who are interested in maquette. Those who participate in entering this competition should call (416) 979-6603 to receive a copy of Guidelines for the Functional Sculpture Competition, which includes an entry form and a simple scale drawing of the terrace. Collaborations between eligible groups are encouraged.

Initial submissions will be reviewed by a selection committee composed of artist and design professionals and curatorial staff from the Art Gallery of Ontario. Up to 10 successful applicants will receive a complete specification package and

The jury's final choices will be announced in September 1992. Up to five works will be commissioned. 




