New team looking into child abuse

Reports of child abuse and neglect have continued to increase rapidly in Halton over the past year, leading to high caseloads for Halton Children's Aid Society social workers. In response, the CAS has temporarily created a new protection team beginning.

Currently, there are two Family Service teams, whose workers investigate reports of child abuse and neglect, and provide ongoing support and supervision for families and children. One team works with children 11 years old and under, the other with adolescents.

On March 16, a team to deal specifically with pre-school age children was formed. This will result in three teams: pre-school and family (ages 0-5), child and family (ages 6-11) and adolescent and family.

Corrie Galloway, former supervisor of the child and family team will supervise the new pre-school team, and social worker Wendy Spengler has been seconded into the temporary position of supervisor of the child and family team. The supervisor of the adolescent and family team, Lou Morris, remains unchanged.

To meet the staffing needs of this new team during a time of financial restraint, the Post-Adoption Support and Adoption Disclosure programs currently run by CAS will be discontinued. Other workers may also be changing their roles within CAS.

This re-organization will help CAS to meet its mandate of protecting children in a time when economic and other factors mean that increasingly high numbers of children are in need of that protection.

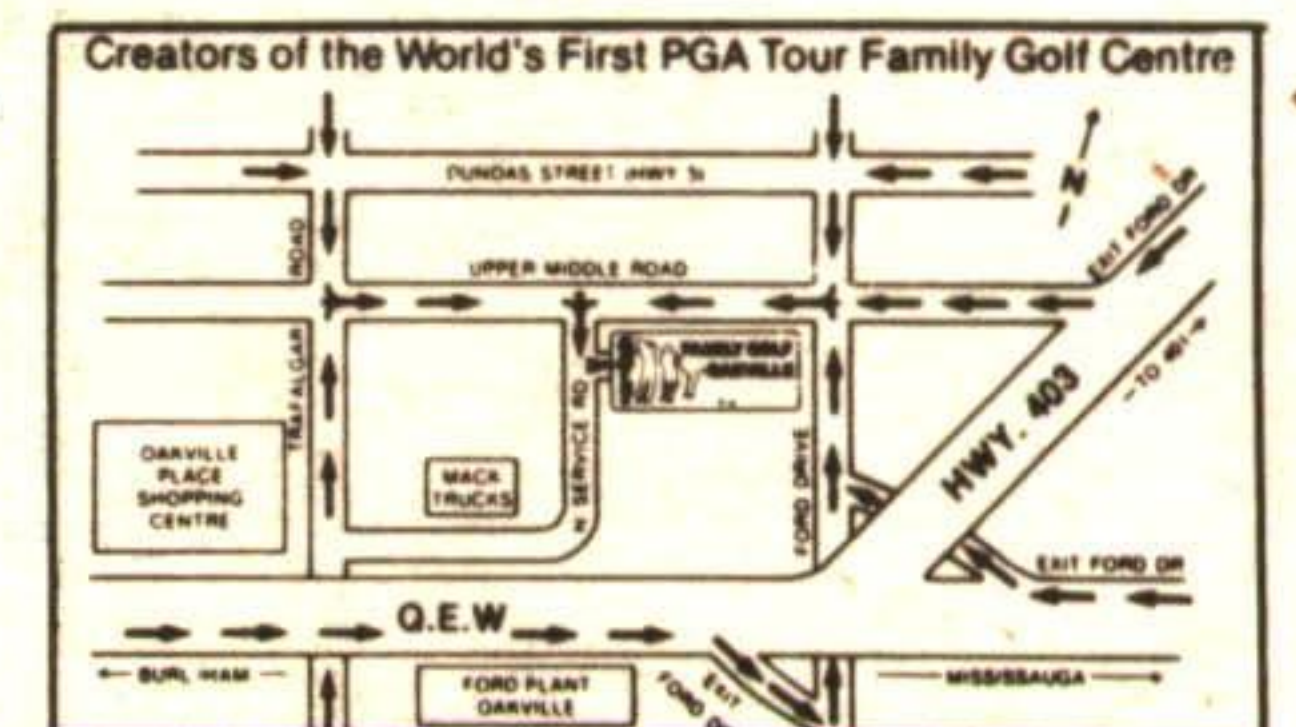
