This meeting was designated as their "International Meeting." President Margaret Jamieson opened with a few words accompanied with pictures.





SPRING CLEAN UP

This is the first day of spring and the very first step that you should take this spring to get your lawn off to a good start, is a thorough raking with a good, stiff leaf rake. Use a leaf rake rather than a steel garden rake. The garden rake will tear away too many parts of the turfgrass plants during this time of year.

A thorough raking will remove the surface accumulation of old leaves and twigs from the fall and winter. Spring raking will allow air and light to reach the turfgrass plants to rejuvenate them. This freshly raked grass is ready for your first fertilizer application.




