# Top of the Slopes

## Changing conditions

Once again we come to that part of the season that brings both warm weather and a change in the snow conditions. This can be the highlight of the ski season with warm sunny days and lighter clothing to ensure a good tan to be shown off during Apre ski activities. The basis for this column is to re-acquaint skiers with some precautions to follow to provide an enjoyable and safe end to the ski season.

Our equipment is what allows us to enjoy the sport of alpine skiing and so should always be maintained correctly. With the warm weather comes heavy snow and what comes to mind first is the skier who has the D.I.N. setting maybe a little high, remember the snow can grab those tips and twist you off balance. You can check your bindings by doing a simple twist out technique to ensure an easy exit. A visual check should also be performed on the bindings and bases, any damage should be repaired by a certified ski technician prior to use.

If you plan on skiing a lot during this part of the season be sure to remove and dry your liners after each use to prevent chaffing. As well check toe and heel pieces and replace if necessary. So sook after your equipment and your equipment will look after you.

In closing I hope my column has been helpful to you this season and if you enjoy skiing as much as I do you are probably already thinking past spring skiing to next season.
