

Halton Region funds Earth Week events

Halton councillors unanimously approved a \$7,500 grant to the Earth Week committee to help pay for its celebrations throughout the region April 20-26. Each municipality will have an information booth set up displaying waste management and environmental materials, plus a festival is to be held in Bronte Park on the last day. Also, a 12-page Earth Week guide will be inserted in a future edition of the Independent/Free Press. "This is the focus we'd like to take with our own joint waste management committee — something that encourages more citizen involvement," public works commissioner Art Leitch told councillors.

Landfill preparations approved

Fermar Paving Ltd. of Rexdale has been hired to install a clay liner, leachate collection systems, roads and other work for Halton's landfill site at a total cost of \$4,004,633. The landfill is located on the west side of Hwy 25, north of Hwy. 5. The

work is expected to be completed by the end of the summer as Halton's officials hope to begin using the site in November. In addition, a landfill compactor was purchased for the sum of \$455,400, and council authorized a second compactor for around the same price should the amount of waste increase to 600,000 tonnes per day.

Watermain replacement

Watermains along College St. and Ontario St. in Georgetown are set to be reconstructed this spring. Calder Hill Contracting of Thornhill has been retained by the region to do the \$115,346 contract. The replacement of the mains is expected to improve water flows and increase fire protection in the area, according to a report.


