SPRING LAWN ROLLING

The problems far outweigh the benefits when considering rolling an established lawn.

Lawn rolling in early spring is something that many people do simply because their family always did it. Others do it for exercise. We suggest another form of exercise . . .

The only beneficial effect of lawn rolling would be to flatten small bumps and slightly level the soil surface. Instead, lawn rolling severely compacts soil and eliminates beneficial air pockets which are required for proper growth and development of turfgrass. This effect can be particularly harmful in the case of heavy clay soils. Once it has been compacted, clay soil will not open again until after the freezing and thawing effect has taken place the following winter.

If you wish to roll your lawn, we suggest you wait until June (after a heavy rain is best). By this time all of the younger grass plants will be mature enough to withstand the pressure of a 150 lb. roller, rolling on top of them. However, because of the compaction created when rolling, aeration would help to relieve some of the compaction. So remember, if you want to roll your lawn, wait until June, and aerate afterwards.


