Quarry licence questioned

Dr. Len Landry again urged Halton Hills council to question the validity of United Aggregates' quarry licence, noting that there is a large difference between its original 1970 permit, and the one reissued in 1990.

Landry pointed out that the original licence, granted to former quarry owner Indusmin Ltd., states that it must follow all provisions under several provincial acts. However, UAL's renewal from the Ministry of Natural Resources only stipulates that no more than three million tonnes of material can be mined per year.

Mayor Russ Miller agreed with

Landry that the alleged "discrepancy" should be investigated, and received support from council to ask the ministry to clarify its position.

Also, the ministry will also be requested to provide the town with a copy of UAL's site plans, which will be made available for public review for a week.

A small hitch developed when councillor Norm Elliott, who chaired the meeting, tried in vain to have any discussions about the quarry held behind closed doors.

Councillors disagreed, and quickly approved Landry's suggestions.

The cause of a fire at 2:20 p.m. at 11566 Tenth Line in Nassagaewya is unknown, however it was extin-

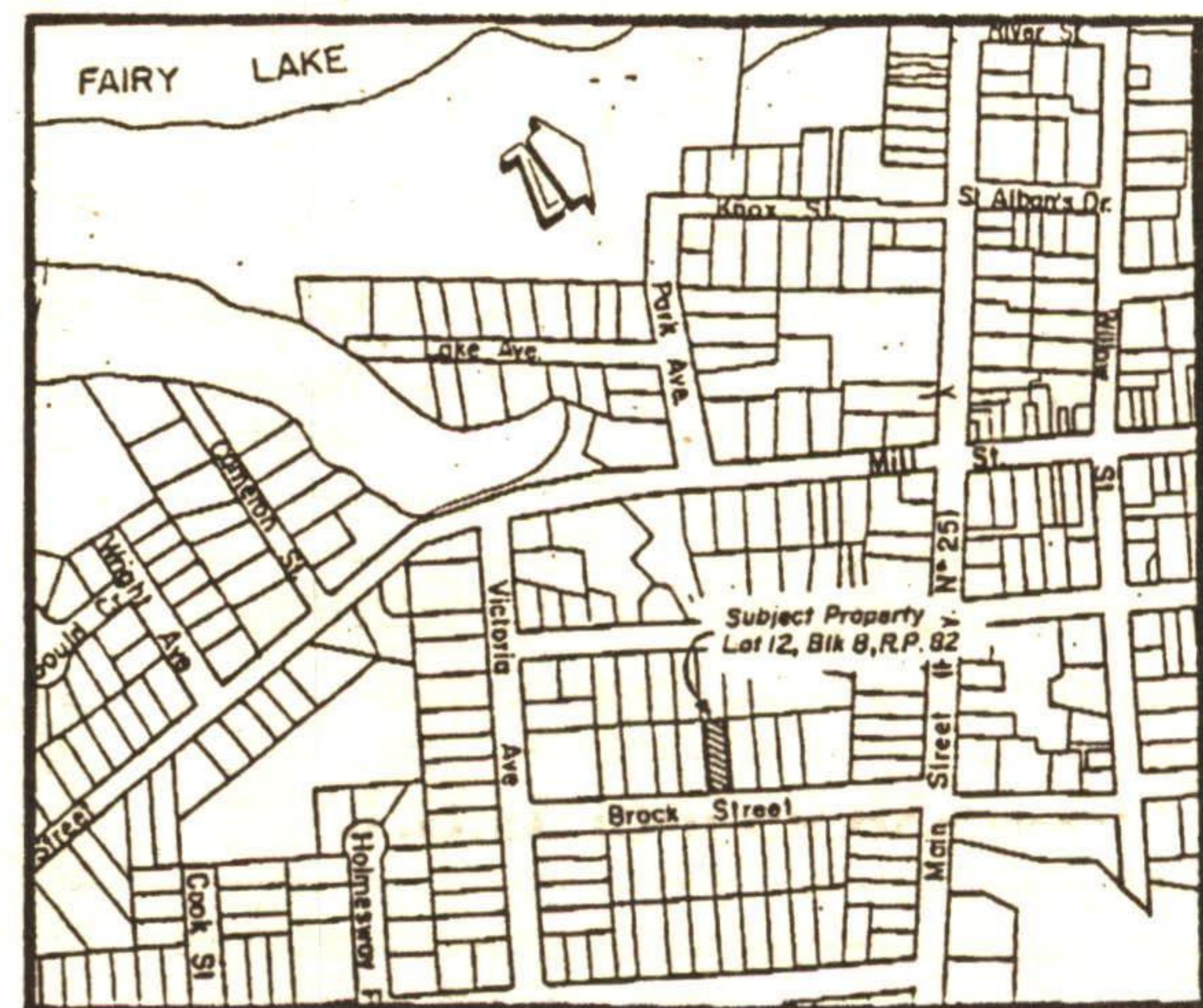
guished with no damage.
