Canadian Tire re-opens

Georgetown's Canadian Tire on Guelph Street celebrated its official grand opening March 26.

The ribbon was cut by Doug Penrice of the Georgetown Chamber of Commerce and several Canadian Tire employees.

"It's their store. It really is their store and their effort," said owner Tom Kase. "It's a tribute to their hard work."

Kase has owned the Georgetown Canadian Tire since June 1991. He has been with the Canadian Tire company since 1979.

Kase is proud of the new "all-out retail" concept that has refurbished his store. Georgetown is the second Canadian Tire in Canada to adopt the new retail look, said Kase.

All-out retail involves high (10 feet) rack units that have replaced old six feet shelving. Over-stock is

placed on the high levels. It may take some time for consumers to get used to the height of stock. Customers don't realize that only the overstock is up high and the same product appears below at a reachable level, said Kase.

"This will position us for the future and help us compete with the retail sector," Kase said. Many more Canadian Tire stores will convert to the all-out retail system.

The all-out retail method "makes efficient use of real estate and allows staff to come out of the non-selling areas (i.e. the warehouse) and be productive on the retail floor," said Kase. Kase explained that this will allow the merchandise to be handled as little as possible and improve customer service.

"We're trying to be as technologically advanced as we possibly can," said Kase.

Georgetown renovations began last July and were primarily completed by November. Kase and his staff had been fine-tuning the store for the grand opening.

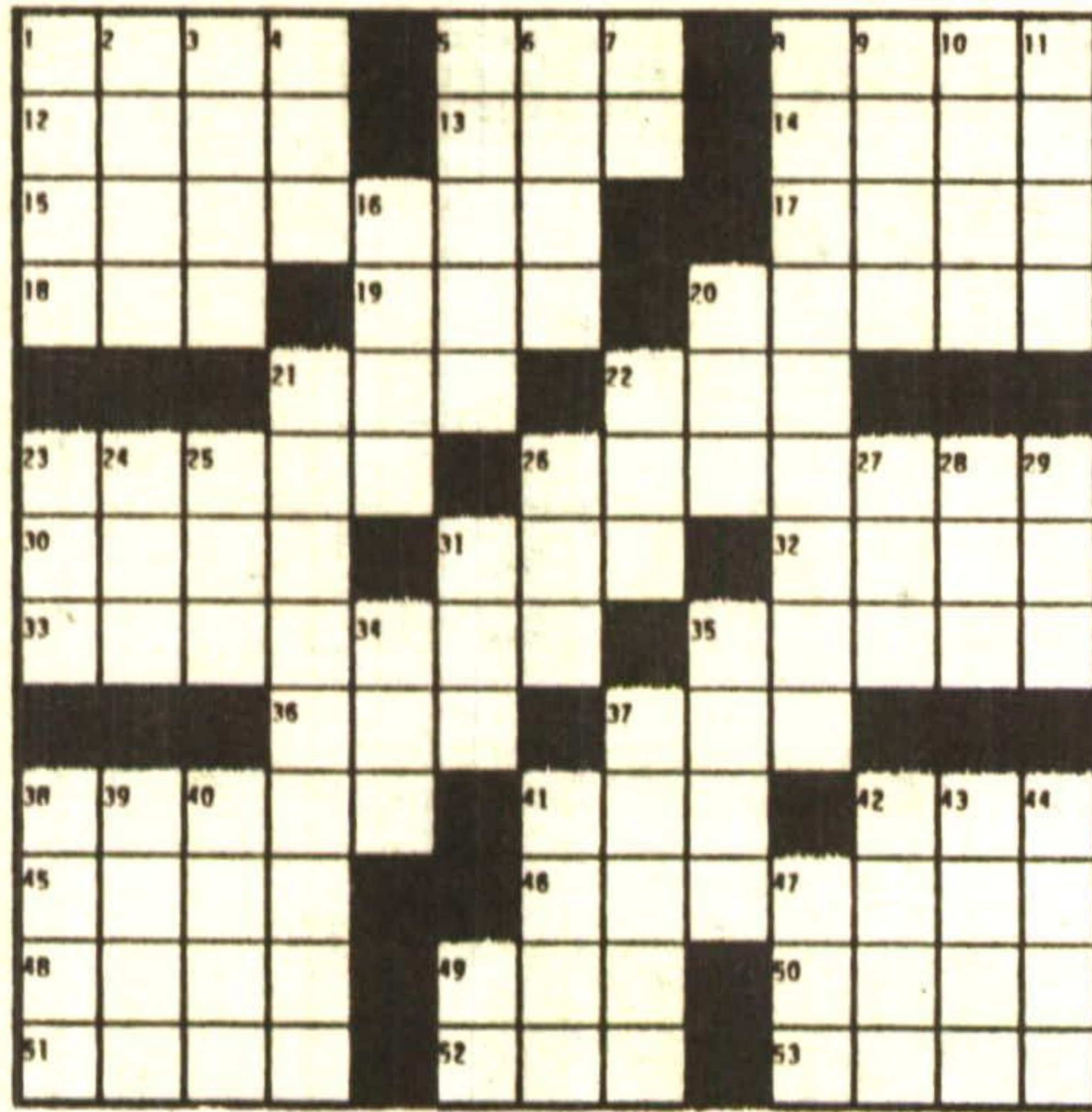

THE FERTILIZER RECIPE

If you, as a homeowner, want to have a great lawn, you must understand the fertilizer recipe. The three main ingredients of this recipe are: Nitrogen, Phosphorus and Potassium. These three elements make up the analysis of a fertilizer. The numbers represent percentages of each nutrient in the bulk total. For example: 25-4-9 means 25% Nitrogen, 4% Phosphorus and 9% Potassium.

Nitrogen is the most important nutrient for turfgrass. Nitrogen is also the most expensive nutrient and required in the greatest quantity by turfgrass plants. Nitrogen is responsible for lush, green colour and turf vigor. Phosphorus aids in root development and is very important when establishing new turf. Potassium or potash is necessary for maintaining hardiness and disease resistance.

Fertilizer must be applied evenly and at the proper rate to prevent burning or leaving stripes on the lawn. By understanding the ingredients in a fertilizer, you can cook up a better lawn.

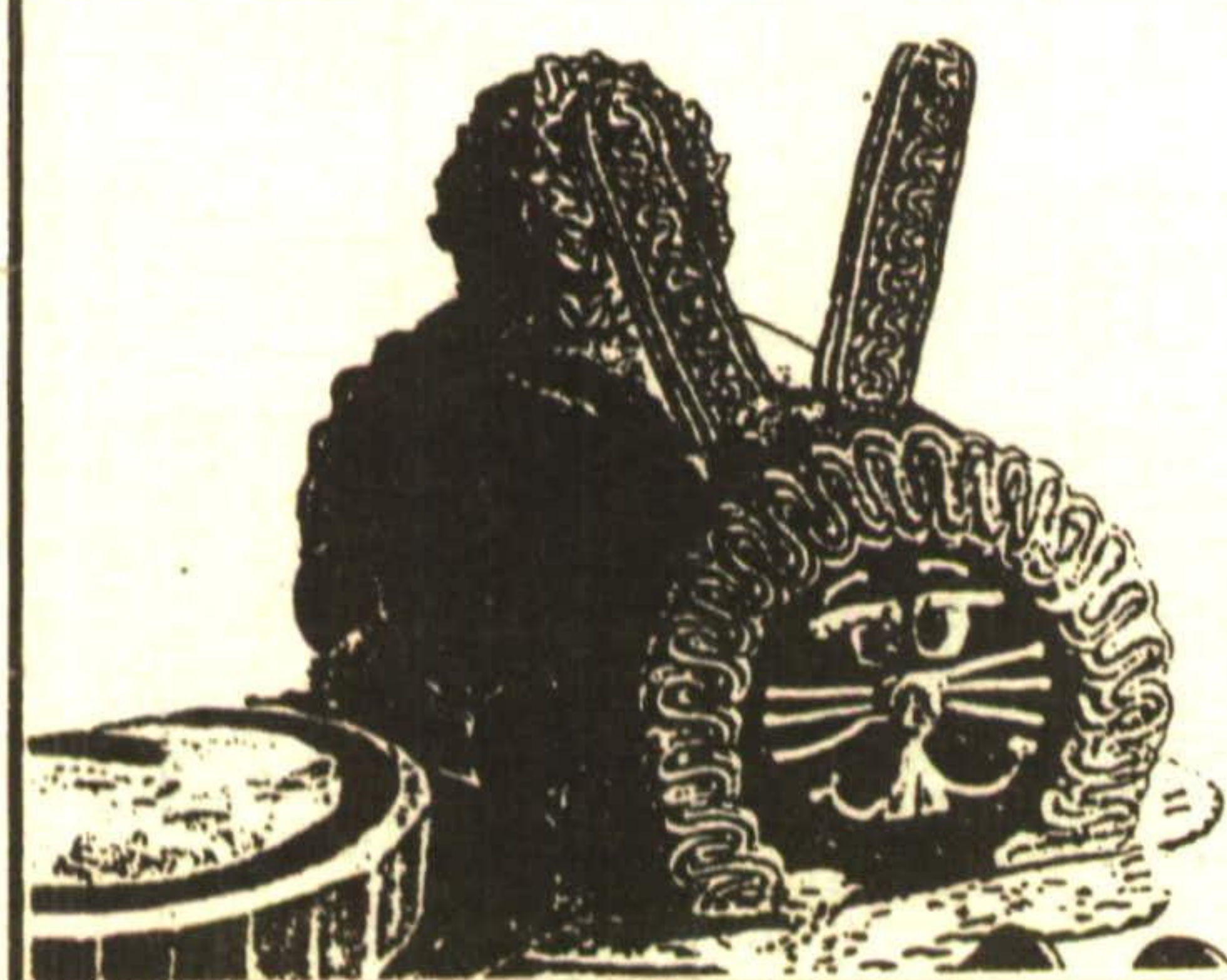
