Written contract vital

When having a driveway paved, get all details of the job carved in stone, then keep a close eye on the

A written contract is considered vital for any renovation project. Paving jobs alone spark about 200 complaints to the Ontario government every year.

Unethical companies who undercut the competition - charging work — were the worst culprits, say representatives of the Ministry of

Relations (MCCR).

They advise that the consumer shop around, but don't pick a contractor based on a low price alone.

Consumers often have trouble with driveway paving jobs because they don't understand what they need, what they're buying or whether they were given what was promised.

Different types of work will be really low prices, but doing lousy required, depending on the condition of the driveway. The job can vary from a simple resurfacing to complete excavation and replace-

ment of the existing pavement.

The quantities of stone and other materials used is crucial, say the ministry experts and this is where a lot of disreputable companies rip people off.

By following five basic rules, consumers can avoid scams, misunderstandings and financial losses. The ministry has produced a detailed guide to driveway paving, providing in-depth information about such things as types of material commonly used, necessary depths, and the different kinds of work involved.

According to the guide, "a sixinch base of stone, topped with two inches of asphalt meets most needs." That "two inches" represents the depth once the asphalt has been compacted. Get three written estimates.

After becoming familiar with materials and terminology used in the paving industry, call at least two contractors for estimates. Be sure each quote is based on the same specifications. Be suspicious of extremely low prices. Get recommendations or references.

Never hire a contractor without talking to at least one recent customer. Read the contract carefully.

It must include the name and address of both the paving company and the customer. Complete details about the job must be listed, including the type of work to be done and driveway dimensions. Depths and qualities of materials to be supplied should also be set out.

A start and completion date should be in the contract and deposits should be kept to a maximum of 10 per cent, experts advise. Keep an eye on work in progress.

Don't get in the way, but be sure the contract is being followed.

According to the ministry, a properly-paved driveway should have a lifespan of at least 10 years. Industry representatives who

helped prepare the paving brochure say most defects show up during the first 12 months and the standard one-year warranty is, therefore, sufficient. Companies are obliged to fulfill

all the provisions of their warranties, so get details in writing. But remember, if the contractor goes out of business, so does the warranty.

Consumers who feel they have been unfairly treated by a paving contractor can contact the nearest Consumer Services Bureau of the ministry for help.

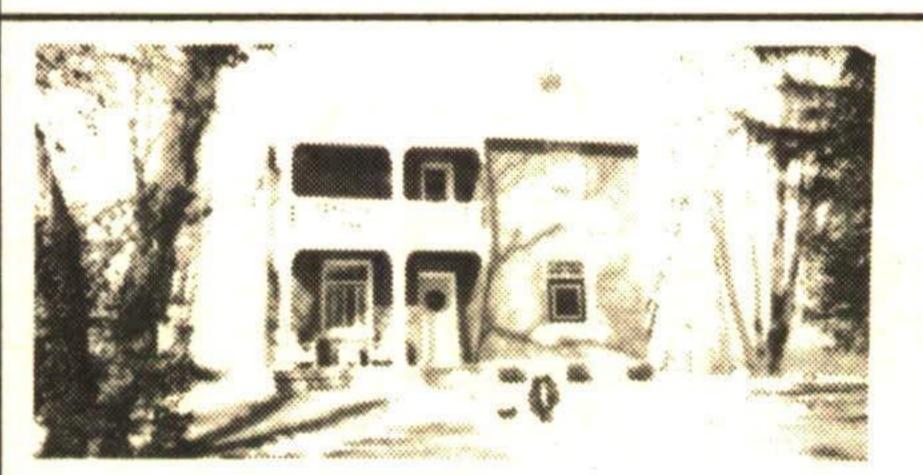

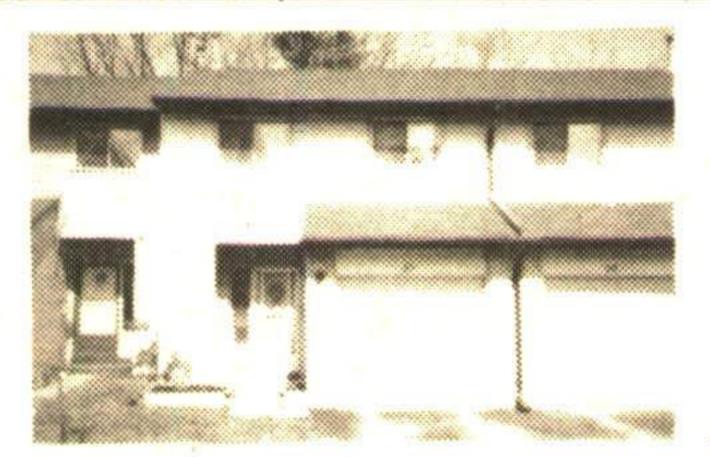
