pets compatible with their decorating and lifestyle. Color and texture are the most important aspects of choosing, but you should also look for quality. Darker and richer colors will make a room more intimate, while lighter colors will make a room appear bigger.

You can increase a room's airiness by matching floor and wall coverings.

Buying carpets once meant choosing the darkest shade possible to hide the dirt your family tracked in every day, but no more. New technology enables manufacturers to make carpets which are practical and beautiful.

New construction of fibres helps carpets to resist soil. The roughness catches dust particles and keeps them on the surface where they can be vacuumed easily. Chemical treatments help prevent the growth of odor-causing bacteria.

If spills are cleaned up quickly, these treatments keep food odors from developing. In advanced-generation nylons, static, a common problem in wool, has been practically eliminated.

Some manufacturers use intense heat on some yarn to lock in the twist in each fibre. This means no more footprints, vacuum marks or shading to mar the beauty of your carpets. With carpets so easy to clean, a whole range of colors has become practical.

The fibre used in carpets can be natural, such as wool or cotton, or man-made, such as nylon, polyester or acrylic. In either case, it is converted into yarn and tufted into pile.

While nothing lasts, feels or takes dye like wool, nothing costs so much either. Good-quality manmade materials are available between \$15 and \$25 a yard, while wool weight generally costs between \$50 and \$100 a yard. The latest nylons are static and soil resistant, more resilient and longer wearing than other synthetics, and get top ratings for durability.

To test the wearability of a carpet, take a sample, double it back
and look at the yarns. If they're
tightly woven and densely packed
and not much jute backing (woven
base is showing), then there is a lot
of fibre to walk on.

Most carpets are labelled with fibre content and density figures which tell you how many tufts there are per square centimeter. The higher the figures, the better the quality.

You will also need to consider into which room in the house the carpet is going. High traffic areas may require higher-quality and more durable carpeting. Shags, for instance, are not good-wearing carpets. When you're walking on them, you're walking on the side of the fibre, not the top.

In general, looped carpeting, a Berber for example, gets top rating for durability and ease of upkeep, while cut pile (plush, saxony, frieze, shag), score high on soft, luxurious appearance.

Carpet care can be summed up in one word, vacuum. Vacuuming helps keep the fibre resilient and upright and takes out dirt particles which wear carpets down. Carpets should be cleaned professionally every two or three years.

Don't skimp on under-padding. Padding adds life to carpeting by absorbing impact.
