
Students return safe and sound



PREPARING A LAWN FOR SEEDING

One of the most important steps of establishing a good lawn, is preparing the site properly. A lawn that is going to be seeded must be as free of broadleaf and grass weeds as possible. Weeds can be physically removed or treated with a recommended weed control material.

Make sure that the lawn site consists of good soil to a depth of at least 8 cm (3 inches). Spend extra time levelling the area. Use a coarse rake and make the soil as flat and smooth as possible. Remove any rocks and debris. Rolling the soil 3 to 4 times in different directions will help alleviate any large air pockets. Be sure to rake the soil after each rolling.

After a lawn site has been properly prepared by levelling and raking, the site is ready for seeding. Obtain your seed from a reputable seed dealer. For most lawns, a seed mixture that contains one or more modern varieties of Kentucky bluegrass, chewings fescue and perennial ryegrass is recommended.

Kentucky bluegrass provides a lush, dark green lawn that is relatively problem-free and is easy to maintain. Chewings fescue is a lighter green grass that blends well with blue grass and grows well in shadier parts of your lawn. Perennial ryegrass is added to a seeded mixture because it germinates quickly and holds the soil and moisture for the slower germinating grasses. Perennial rye grass is also quite resistant to turfgrass disease problems.


