

Hop Irish is turning heads in Princess Pacing Series

Hop Irish isn't yet a household name around Mohawk Raceway but lately the three year old Albatross filly is certainly stirring up lots of conversation.

On Sunday, April 26, for the second consecutive week in the Princess Pacing Series, Hop Irish left both her foes and the fans gasping with her performance. Despite drawing seven trainer/driver David Keyes had his filly on top before the blink of an eye and cut fractions of :27.3, :57.4, and 1:25.4 before cruising home four lengths up in 1:55. The time represented the fastest local clocking by a female in 1992. Greater Love and Nancinprinceton finished in a dead heat for the runner-up position.

"I've never had a horse like her, she was on cruise control tonight," praised Keyes. "Last week (a win in 1:56.2) gave us some indication that she had this kind of speed, but it's still surprising."

For the record Hop Irish now has seven wins in 10 starts this year for Mississauga owner Norman Keyes, who added, "I'm truly thrilled with the challenge coming next week against Tarport Sensation. She beat us in the Blizzard final (at Greenwood in January), maybe we can even the score."

In the second division Cinnamon

Reel upset favored Tarport Sensation by a diminishing neck in 1:55.3, thus ending the latter's unbeaten streak at six. Paul MacDonell engineered Cinnamon Reel to victory, overcoming a break at the half, before quickly getting her back on stride. "I think she might have got over-pacing herself," explained MacDonell. Cinnamon Reel is trained by William Elliot for owners Pat Daly Jr. and Dan Daly of Hamilton.

The \$68,000 final of the Princess Series was set for Saturday, May 2.

On Sunday, Mohawk hosted the first ever Milton Area Community Awareness Night, a tradeshow consisting of exhibits from area business, industry and service groups.
