Van de Valk pleased with progress

Continued from page 1 Wastewise employs one manager, two operators, five part-time students and over 60 volunteers.

In total, 239,620 pounds of paper, clothing, plastics, shoes and other reusables were diverted from landfills, along with an estimated 132,000 pounds of newspapers, books, cans and glass.

It has participated in many community events such as the Georgetown and Acton fall fairs, produced a guide on how to start a resource centre and was the focus of a video by an internationallybased waste reduction advocacy group. In addition, it has assisted six companies in locating markets for their waste, conducted 26 presentations and 41 tours to various community groups and is used by 25 local companies recycling and reusing their waste.

Van de Valk hopes to expand Wastewise by working with Halton Region to reduce waste even further. She is lobbying for a grant in the amount of \$30,000 to establish a one-year contract position, which will: establish and chair a committee to begin a neighborhood program designed to educate people on hazardous household waste, backyard composting and participation with Wastewise; organize volunteer time in a more formal manner; and seek out volunteers with specialized skills to assist Wastewise.

"Wastewise is one step in a long journey toward a sustainable society and we are confident that this centre is heading in the right direction," her report concluded.


