

### Mountsberg gets grant

Mountsberg Conservation Area, just west of Campbellville, will receive a \$125,000 federal Environmental Partners grant for a new centre for birds of prey.

The Environmental Partners Fund is a five year, \$50 million program designed to stimulate partnerships between local groups and the federal government for projects that will help solve environmental problems.

The Mountsberg Centre for Birds of Prey is an innovative project that will protect and rehabilitate hundreds of hawks and owls that are injured annually in the Golden Horseshoe area of Ontario.

The centre will provide extended care and treatment for birds that are to be released back into the wild as well as serve as a relocation release site for birds of prey that trapped at Pearson International Airport.

The project also includes a high level of public involvement with the provision of an education program that will have 75,000 annual visitors. This integrated information/education component ultimately provides protection for birds of prey by promoting an awareness and understanding of the resource.


The \$125,000 federal grant will be

matched by the Friends of a Feather Committee that was formed to initiate the project. Other partners include the Halton Region Conservation Authority and Foundation, along with the Friends of the Environment Foundation chapter (Canada Trust) from Burlington, Oakville and Milton.

Mountsberg outdoor education instructor Debbie Jackson is excited about the bird of prey centre. "It's important for people to realize that we release over 80 per cent of the birds that we treat," said Jackson.

The birds that are kept as permanent residents at Mountsberg have either been imprinted on people so that they cannot be released as they wouldn't survive or they have permanent disabilites.

A sod turning ceremony will be held at Mountsberg today, Sunday, May 24 at 2:30 p.m. to officially kick off the construction of the Mountsberg Centre for Birds of Prey, which is expected to be completed by next year. Everyone is invited to watch the ceremony and participate in the First Annual Wild Bird Fair that includes a wide range of arts, crafts and bird watching exhibits.


