Music teachers join forces

During the past 50 odd years, there have been great strides made in music education. Pioneer educators, including Suzuki in Japan, Carl Orff in Germany, Zoltan Kodaly in Hungary, and Jacques Dalcroze in France, have developed singular and new "methods."

Briefly, Suzuki educates through a listening approach, Orff, through creativity, Kodaly, through singing and Dalcroze, through movement. There is some overlapping, to develop all skills, but these are the basic impulses of each method. Contemporary training of school music teachers includes training in these disciplines.

Each of these four are offered through the Royal Conservatory of Music in downtown Toronto. The Royal Conservatory's nearest branch in Brampton offers Orff and preparatory music. Orff, preparatory music and Suzuki violin are all available independently in Milton.

Orff is coming to Georgetown;

classes will begin in September 1992. There will be two levels for children of ages six to 12. Orff aims to develop musicianship through listening, singing and movement. Creativity is stressed and includes playing on percussion instruments of all kinds, including xylophones. Preparatory music classes ("Music for Fun") will continue at three levels for children of ages two to six.

Also new this fall, local children will have the opportunity of joining a new children's chorus, led by Mr. Dale Wood, director of the Georgetown Choral Society. Watch the paper for more information.

There are several very good private music teachers in town. Some of them have recently formed a Town of Halton Hills Music Educators Association. They will endeavor to improve, support and encourage all kinds of music education and are hoping to provide some impetus for local community events. 
