

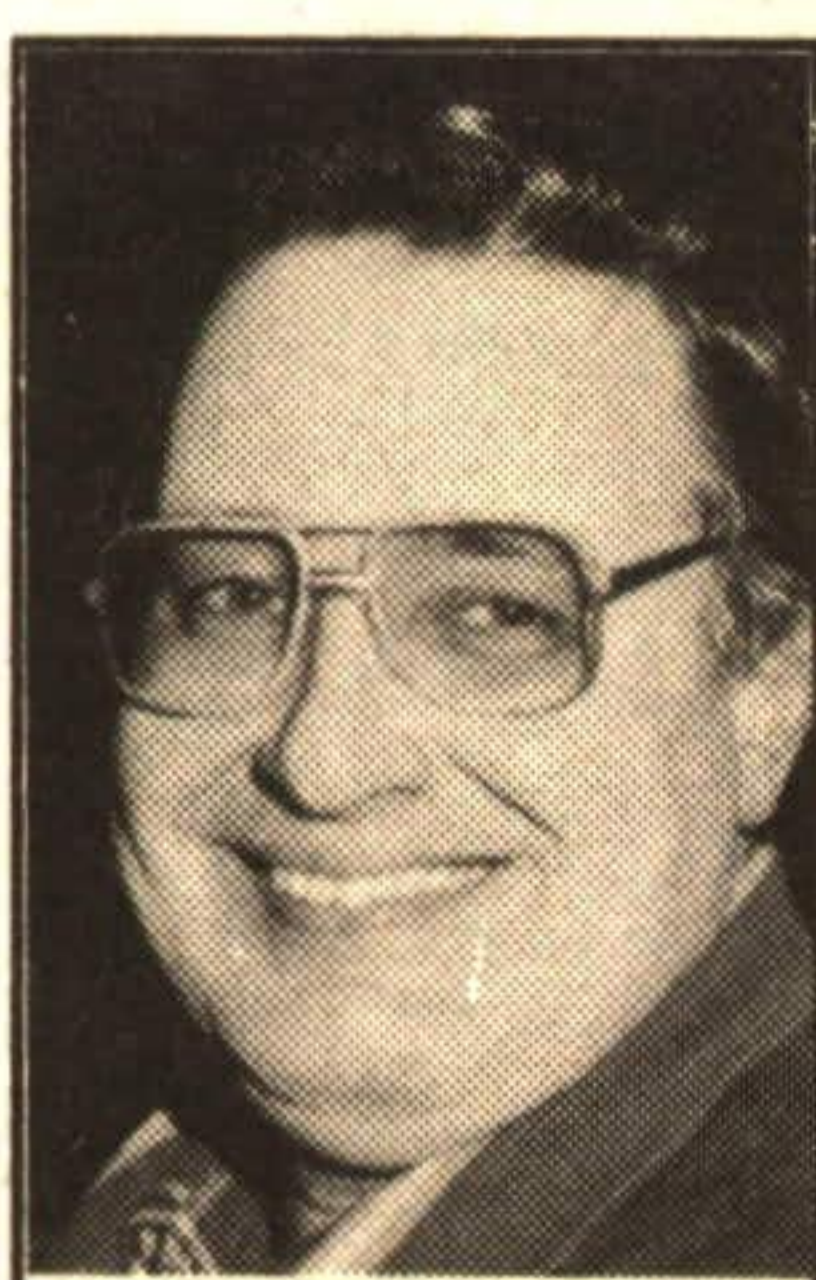
Douglas McDonald was avid sportsman

Douglas McDonald passed away quite suddenly on his "fourth generation" 200 acre family farm at RR1 Terra Cotta on Monday, May 11, 1992. He was born November 29, 1944 and purchased the family farm from his parents, the late John (Jack) Andrew and Marjorie McDonald in 1970.

He will be sadly missed by his wife, Shirley Brander, and their three children, Wendy, Heather and John as well as two sisters, Edith (Mrs. Gary Roberts) Wallacetown, and Joan (Mrs. Archie MacDonald) Willowdale, and one brother, Jim of Walkerton along with his many friends.

Douglas graduated from Streetsville High School in June, 1964 and immediately began working with his father on the dairy farm. Just last year, Doug sold the Holstein dairy herd and began a beef cow/calf operation.

Doug was always very involved with sports and community organizations. During high school, he was a member of the school's basketball and football teams. In his youth, he was an active member in many 4-H

clubs and later served as a leader in 4-H. Doug's active participation in Alcoa and Peel County Junior Farmers won him the Junior Farmer's Overseas Trip to the United Kingdom in 1969.

During his lifetime, Doug was a member and director of Georgetown Co-op, of Peel County Federation of Agriculture, of Peel County Holstein Fresian Association, as well as president of Peel County Soil and Crop Improvement Association.

As Doug's family became involved in baseball and hockey, Doug too, became an active participant. He served as an assistant coach and coach for Caledon Minor Hockey and Cheltenham Minor Baseball. Doug also enjoyed curling and was a member of Brampton

Curling Club.

Visitation was from the J.S. Jones and Son Funeral Home, Georgetown on Wednesday, May 13. Funeral service and interment were held May 14 at Union Presbyterian Church, the church Doug worshipped in since childhood.

Rev. Mary Campbell conducted the service. Shirley Inglis was organist and included two old hymns, "Great is Thy Faithfulness" and "Abide with Me." Two special numbers were sung by Irene Kerby, "Gentle Lord and Gently Lead Us" and "The Lord's Prayer."

Interment was in Union Church Cemetery. Pallbearers were Dave Anderson, John Downey, Jim Moore, Terry Leslie, Ken Williamson and Bert Speirs. Flower bearers were Bob Cation, Herb Dolson, Harry Moore and Len Odell.

The many floral tributes and memorial donations to the Heart and Stroke Foundation and other charities, plus the host of sorrowing friends bore testimony to the love and respect in which Doug was held.

Councillor set to investigate funding

Councillor Bill Robson promised that he will investigate how private citizens can qualify for funds to help them "fight unwanted development" at the Ontario Municipal Board (OMB).

Robson noted recently that "the little people lose" at OMB hearings, because of the "inordinate amount of money" it takes to be represented there.

Planning director Ian Keith suggested that OMB officers may award costs at their discretion, but otherwise there is "no level of funding available" to the public.

"This is a real issue for ratepayers, so I'll do some investigating at the provincial government," Robson replied.

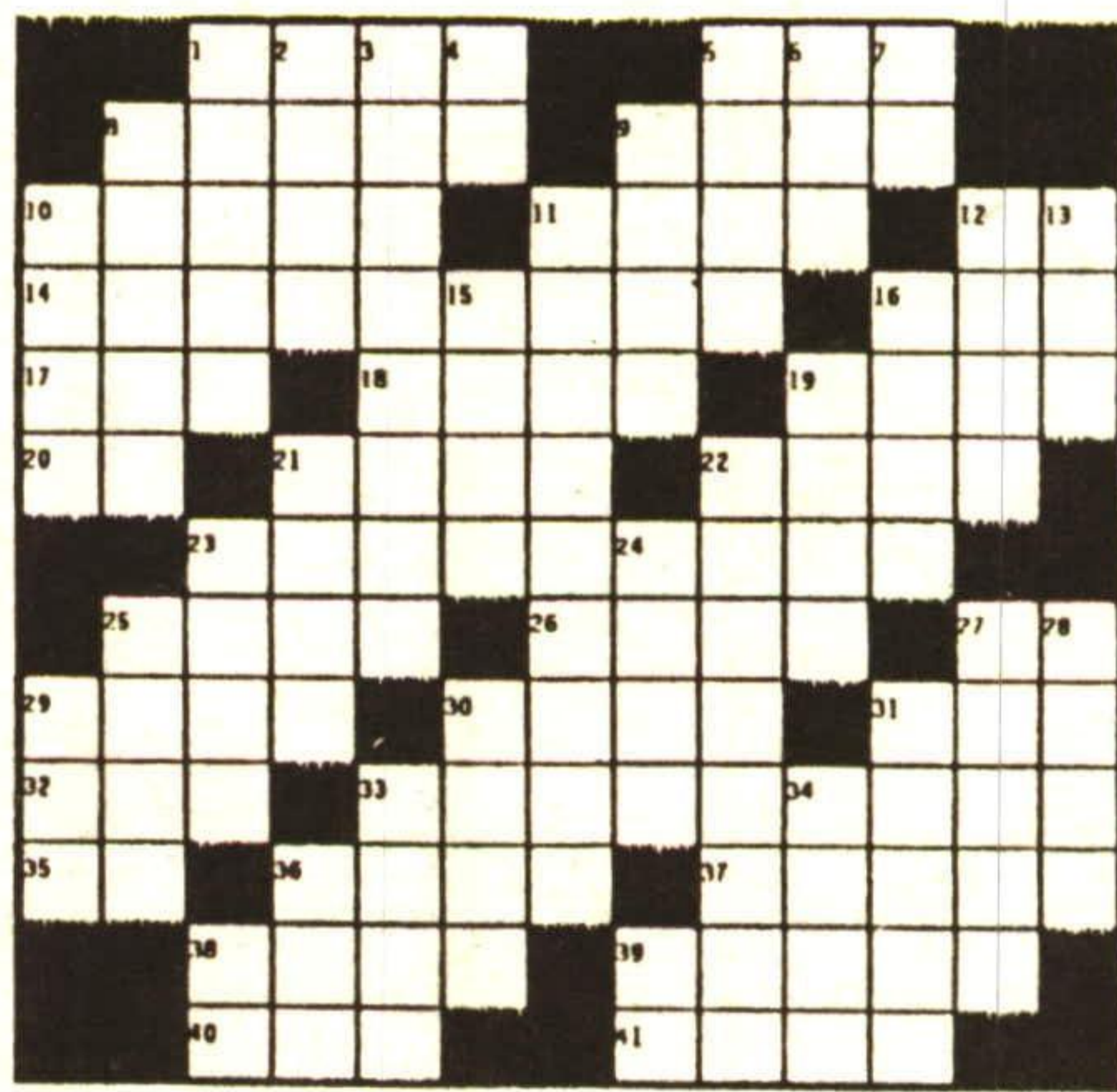
