

Serjeantson wants to encourage developers to maintain and clean up properties

Developers with vacant lots should be encouraged to keep them tidy for the benefit of the homeowners around them, insists councillor Marilyn Serjeantson. "People can't stand the mess — I'd like to see the developer grade the land and seed it, to help keep it clean," Serjeantson complained to her colleagues Monday night. "We must do something to encourage developers to maintain their own lots...They're unsightly, and it detracts from what everyone else is doing (on their properties)."

Town administrator Dan Costea noted that under normal subdivision agreements, developers are obligated to maintain and clean up their properties. However, those lots that have not been built upon are not covered under such agreements. "Whether we can have the owner grade and seed his private lot is probably not covered by the (subdivision) agreement," Costea said. "But, we will take a look at the property standards bylaw. The only other jurisdiction maybe the littering bylaw."
