# No surprises as flag football season kicks off

It was a cold and blustery day. A rather cliched start to an anything but normal opening day, May 24, of the 1992 Men's Flag Football League.

If the weather was unpredictable the results of the first weeks action were not. Perennial powerhouses, the Dawgs, Longhorns and Kaznic Electric, all posted victories over their respective opponents.

### Meznic vs Plus Welding

In the day's first match-up, Meznic Electric edged out a new and improved version of a Plus Welding squad, 9-6.

M and M's lone score was by Stu Hurst. Hurst also managed to snag a two pointer for the Sportsmen. In addition to Clements' two interceptions, Patrick Litowski and Mike Delguidice recorded steals for the Dawgs. Huge Horace Thomas snared a Dawg delivery for a turnover of his own. In addition, Thomas performed admirably at quarterback for the M and M unit.

The Dawgs look as if they had a lean winter and apparently are hungry to retain the silverware in '92. They will face some strong challenges from a number of teams including the new team in the league, New Kids on the Block. This new collection of players had week one off and we'll have to wait to see if youth and energy can match up with experience and cunning.

## Donker fourth

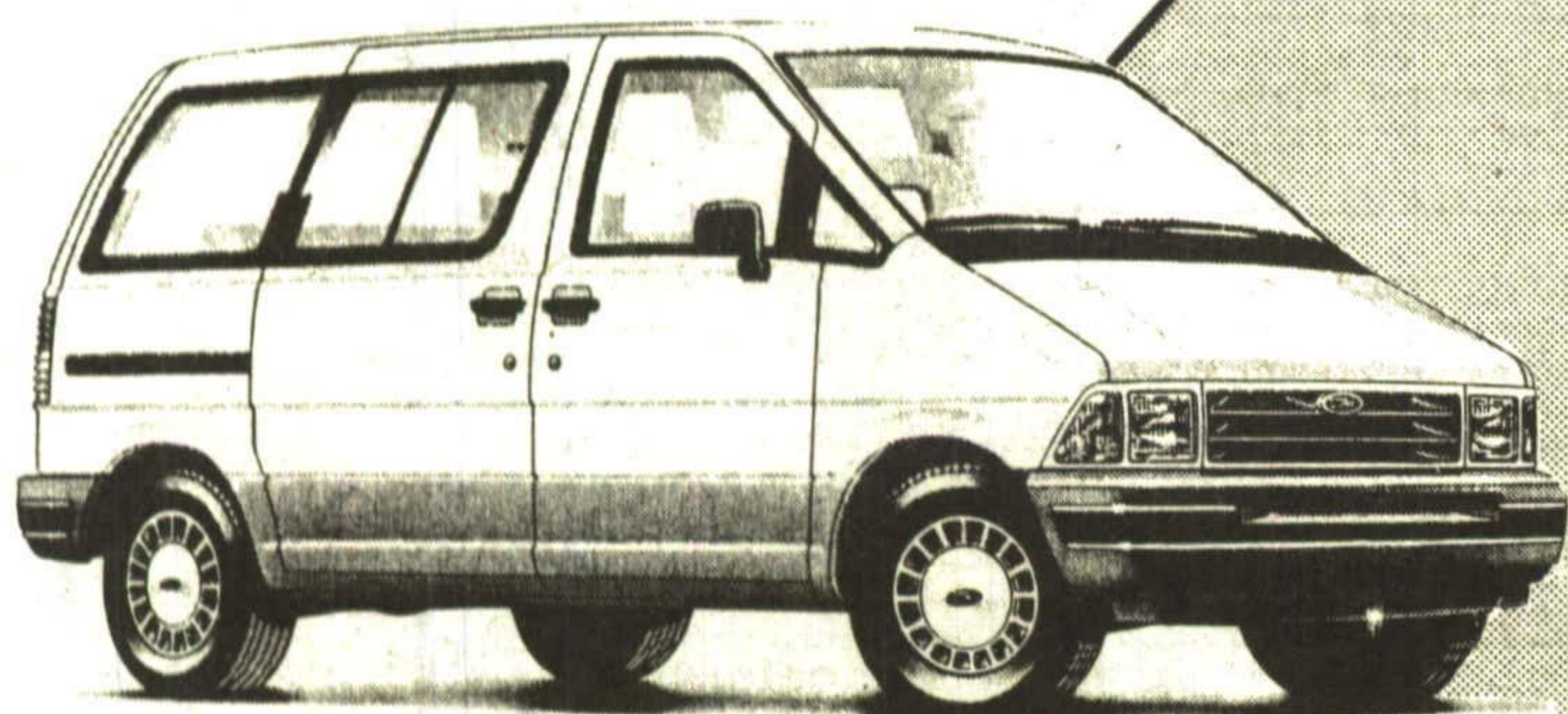
A Georgetown man was among the top five runners in Sunnybrook Health Science Centre's 10-kilometre Run for Research, held Sunday, May 24.

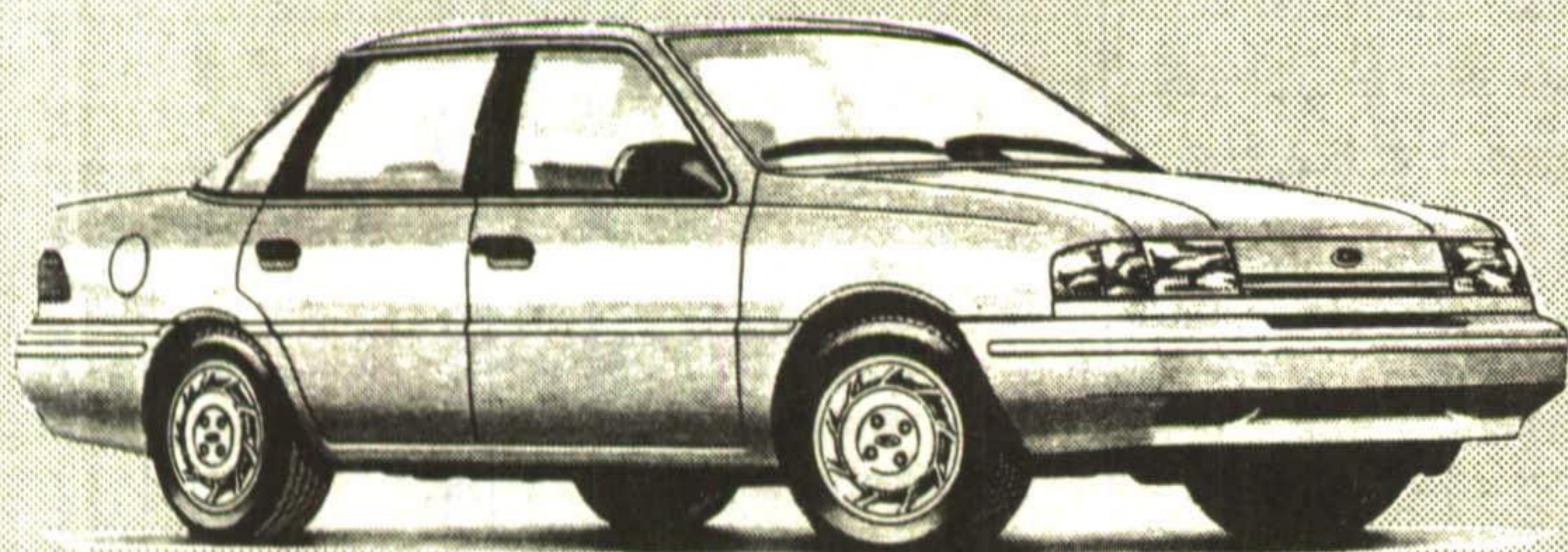
