Halton Hills' new Amnesty International group, now one year old, has just received full accreditation with the human rights organization's head office in London, England.

This makes them Group 196 in Canada, ready to begin work on a specific Action File assigned only to accredited groups.

To become accredited, a group must have at least five paid members, must be financially selfreliant, and must be prepared for sustained, continuing effort over many months and perhaps years on a particular goal.
