

DON'T WORRY. IT IS NOT TOO LATE!

So, your lawn was a real mess with Dandelions this spring?

You didn't get around to controlling them and the yellow blossoms are now white seed heads. Don't worry, it is not too late to get those Dandelions controlled.

Weed control products act as plant growth hormones which are taken into plant tissues. These specific plant hormones cause the plant to "grow itself to death" and use up food sources. Even though your Dandelions have gone to seed, weed control will still be effective.

Controlling Dandelions in you lawn is important, because "broad" leaves of the Dandelion take up precious lawn space. As these weeds continue to

grow, they smother new grass shoots while using

up valuable nutrients and water.



Once the Dandelions and other "broadleaf" weeds are controlled the grass will have an opportunity to fill in the areas where the weeds use to be (Seeding may be necessary.)
