sive process which would likely reach the same conclusion — that the landfill proposal is "woefully inadequate."

"The onus is on RSI to fulfill the requirements of the (EAA)," he added. "The clear intent of the (EAA) was to remove the function of approval from behind closed doors and place it out in the open for before decision' all to see and participate in. If (RSI's application)

is to be considered a (proper) EA, then we will go back to pre-1975, back to permit granting behind

closed doors....Society has said, 'we won't accept those risks unless you, the proponent, provide sufficient information. Then we'll review it and consider it on its merits. Otherwise, don't waste our time and money at a hearing."

Should the board not favor FOAD's opinion, Edward requested that they refer the matter to the divisional court for review.

However, RSI's lawyer Michael

Jeffery argued at length Thursday morning that it would be unfair for the board to dismiss everything at this stage in the game, without having had the opportunity of hearing all of the evidence. Such a proceeding would take place at a full hearing, when evidence and cross-examination of "expert" witnesses occur.

"You're being asked to accept their opinions, without allowing RSI to challenge that position, which would exclude the public from the most public part of the process," Jeffery said, again urging for RSI to have its day in court. "To suggest that the board find that 20 volumes of documentation is not an EA, is a course of action that this board should avoid at all

Board chairman Mary Munro predicted at the conclusion of the hear-

ing that it will likely be some time before they make a decision on whether the matter should proceed to a main hearing.

In an interview immediately afterwards, Edward showered praise on the board members, noting that they "displayed a deep insight into the legal framework."

He added that his request for the divisional court to decide the matter was a way out for the board to shy away from such a broad deci-


sion. However, because of their apparent abilities, Edward reasoned that they will probably make the decision themselves.

"Sometimes we don't know how a board will deal with the details or the complexities of law, which is the reason why we proposed the refer-

ral," he added. "That is why the legislation provides that opportunity for a referral to court — it's a builtin safety valve for the board."



#### **CLEANING YOUR DENTURES**

Keeping your dentures clean is the most important patient responsibility in good oral health. Dentures, like natural teeth, attract plaque, become stained, and collect food particles that can cause bad breath. The two best methods of cleansing dentures are brushing and soaking.

#### **BRUSHING**

The most effective cleansing method is brushing with a special denture brush and paste. Use a special denture paste, as regular toothpastes may be too abrasive, and can damage the acrylic surface of your dentures. Brushing daily will maintain the bright natural appearance, as well as leaving your mouth feeling fresh. Brushing is particularly recommended for removal of plaque. The best cleansing method is to combine both brushing and soaking.
