Bacteria levels high CVCA tests show

The Credit Valley Conservation Authority has identified three hot spots after preliminary water quality test results have returned from a Ministry of Environment laboratory with high fecal coliform bacteria counts, the main indicator of sewage pollution.

Water samples were taken at 18 stations throughout a subwatershed along the West Credit River near Hillsburgh and Erin. Ministry of Environment standards for fecal coliform bacteria are 100 organisms per 100 milliliters of water. Samples taken last Wednesday showed twice the acceptable amount of fecal coliform bacteria in the Stanley Park ponds; twice the acceptable level downstream from Hillsburgh at the 17th Sideroad and nearly six times the acceptable levels on an Eighth Line tributary of the West Credit above Erin.

"This is the first of many samples to be taken to help pinpoint pollution sources on the Credit River," said Marta Soucek, coordinator of

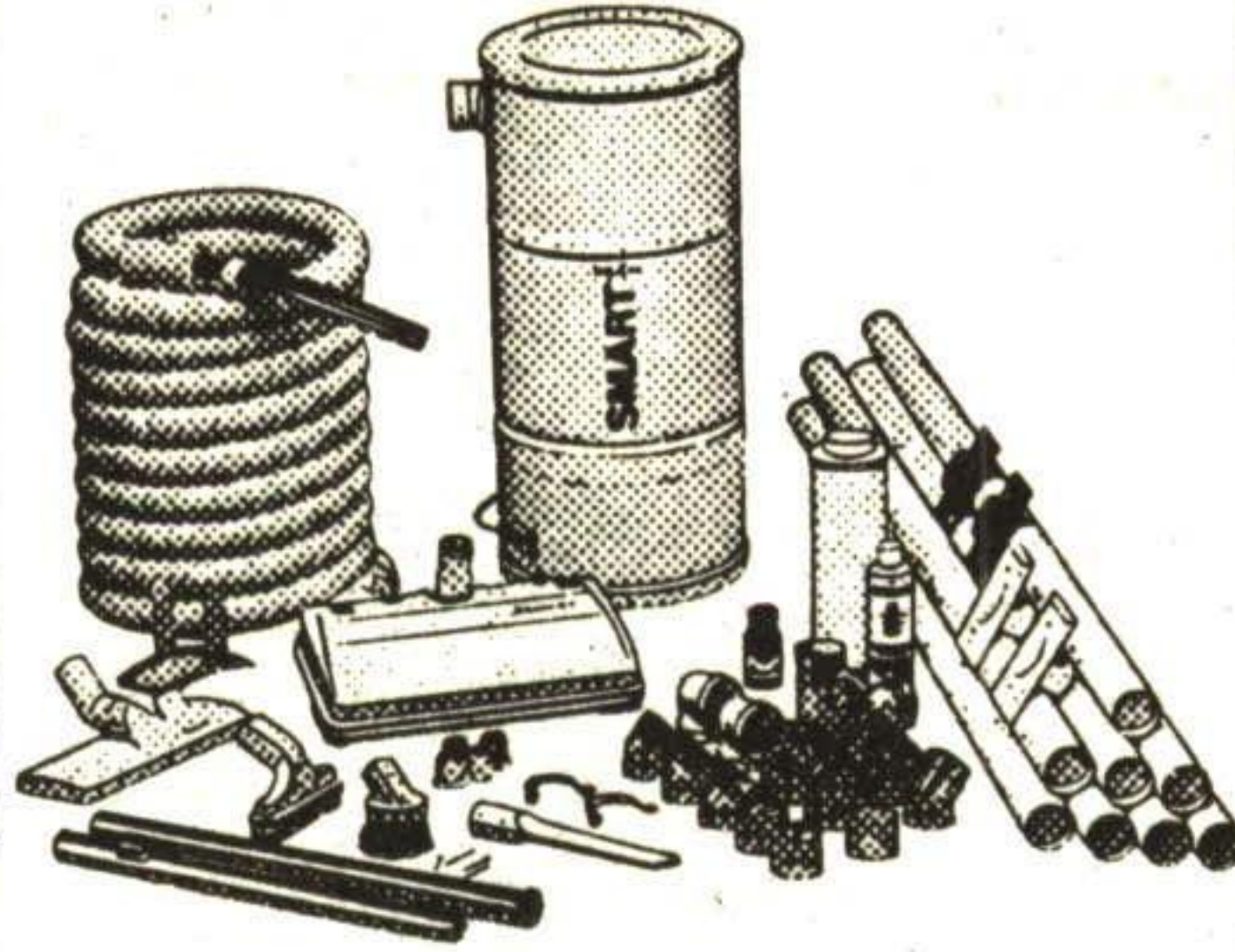
the Rural Beaches Program for the CVCA. "Our goal is to help clean up rural beaches by locating pollution sources and educating polluters on ways to clean up problems and government funds available to assist."

Of specific concern is the swimming area at the Belfountain Conservation Area which has been closed due to consistently high bacteria levels in the past. Surprisingly low bacteria counts were found this time in Belfountain but biologists warn that it is still very early in the season with temperatures and rainfall increases, higher bacteria counts are expected.

The CVCA will be collecting water samples every week throughout the summer months and arranging to meet with farmers and residence on private septic systems who may be contributing to pollution problems in the river.

Water contaminated in the northern reaches of the watershed has a serious effect on everyone using the river system down to Lake Ontario.
