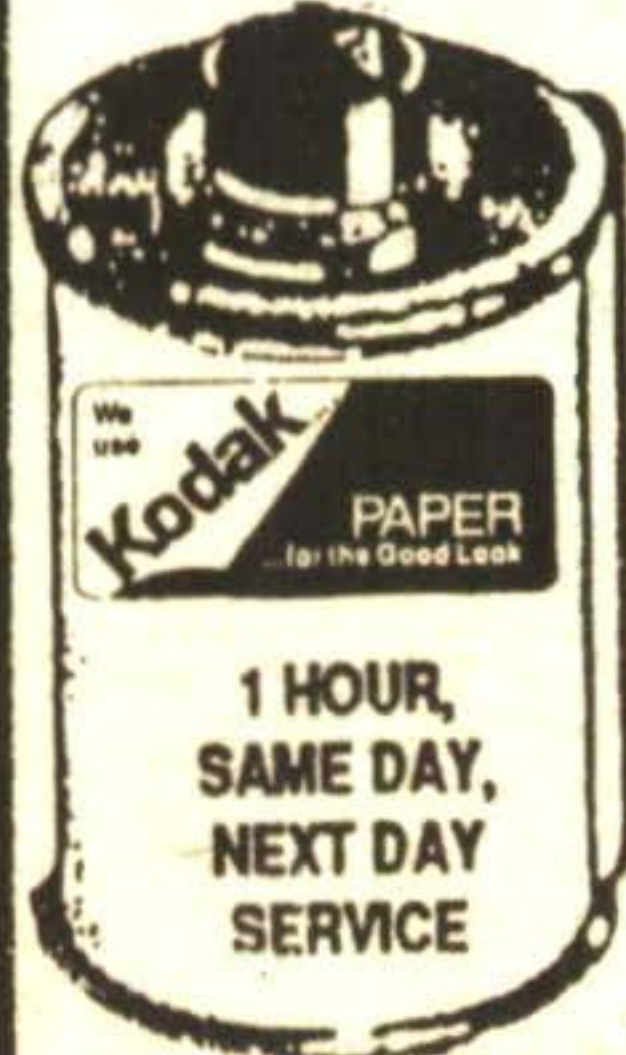

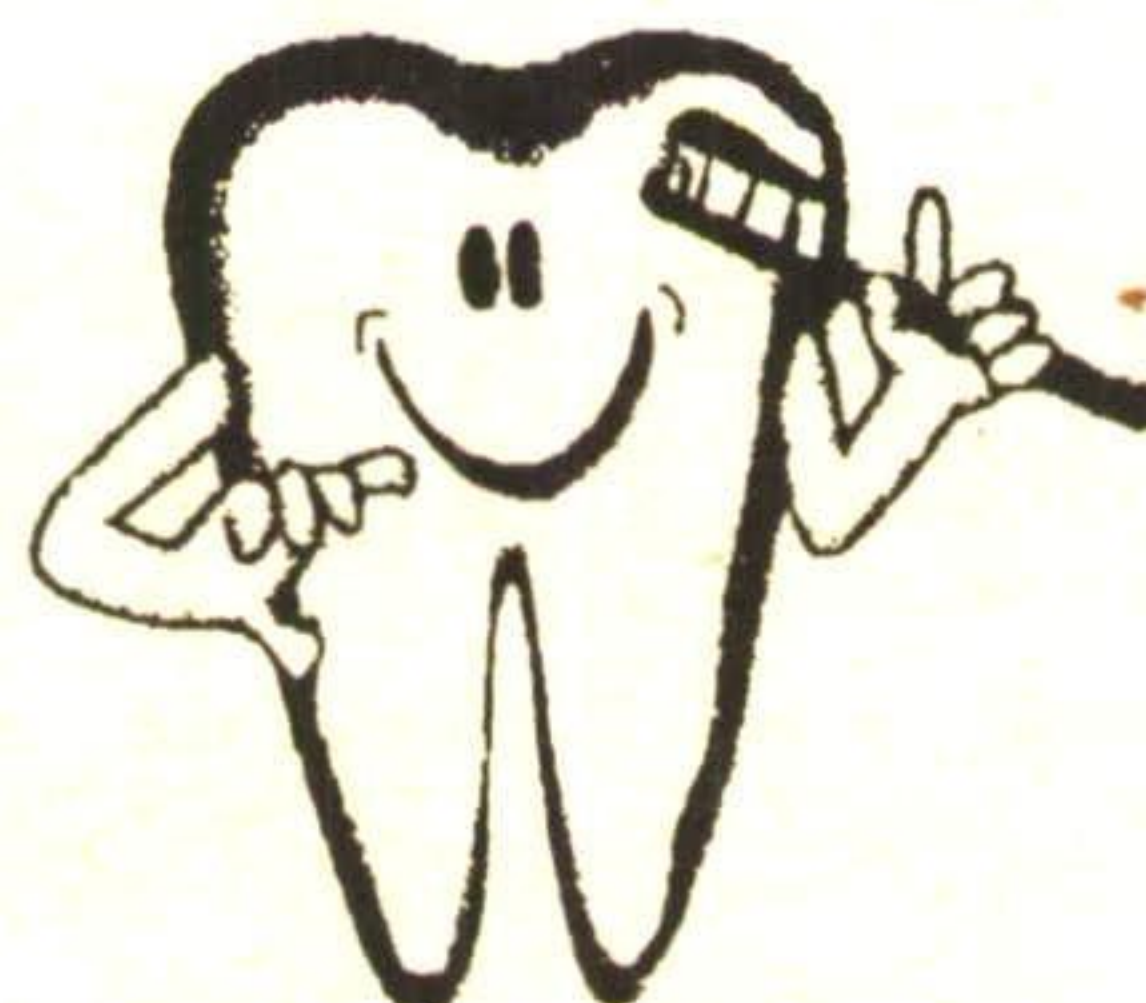

Building materials

The vehicle left the road, rolled over and struck a tree, uprooting it. According to police, the car was demolished. The driver and his 16 year old passenger suffered only minimal injuries. The driver has been charged with careless driving, said police.

Accident

Late afternoon Monday a 1983 Ford van travelling southbound on Guelph Street, Georgetown in an attempted to avoid a turning car went out of control and fishtailed, according to police. The two vehicles collided and the van ended up in the ditch, according to police reports. The driver of the van, a 64 year old Brampton man, has been charged with making an unsafe lane change.

Store break-in

A grocery store on Sinclair Avenue, Georgetown, was broken into early Tuesday morning. Culprits smashed a front plate glass window and stole an unknown quantity of loose packages of cigarettes in various brands. The store's alarm system failed to activate, said police. A 6' X 8' double plate glass window was damaged, estimated at \$1,000.

Car phone stolen

Tuesday night a mounted car phone was unscrewed and taken from a 1989 Ford Talon parked on Kingham Road in Acton. The phone was the property of a Mississauga company. Police

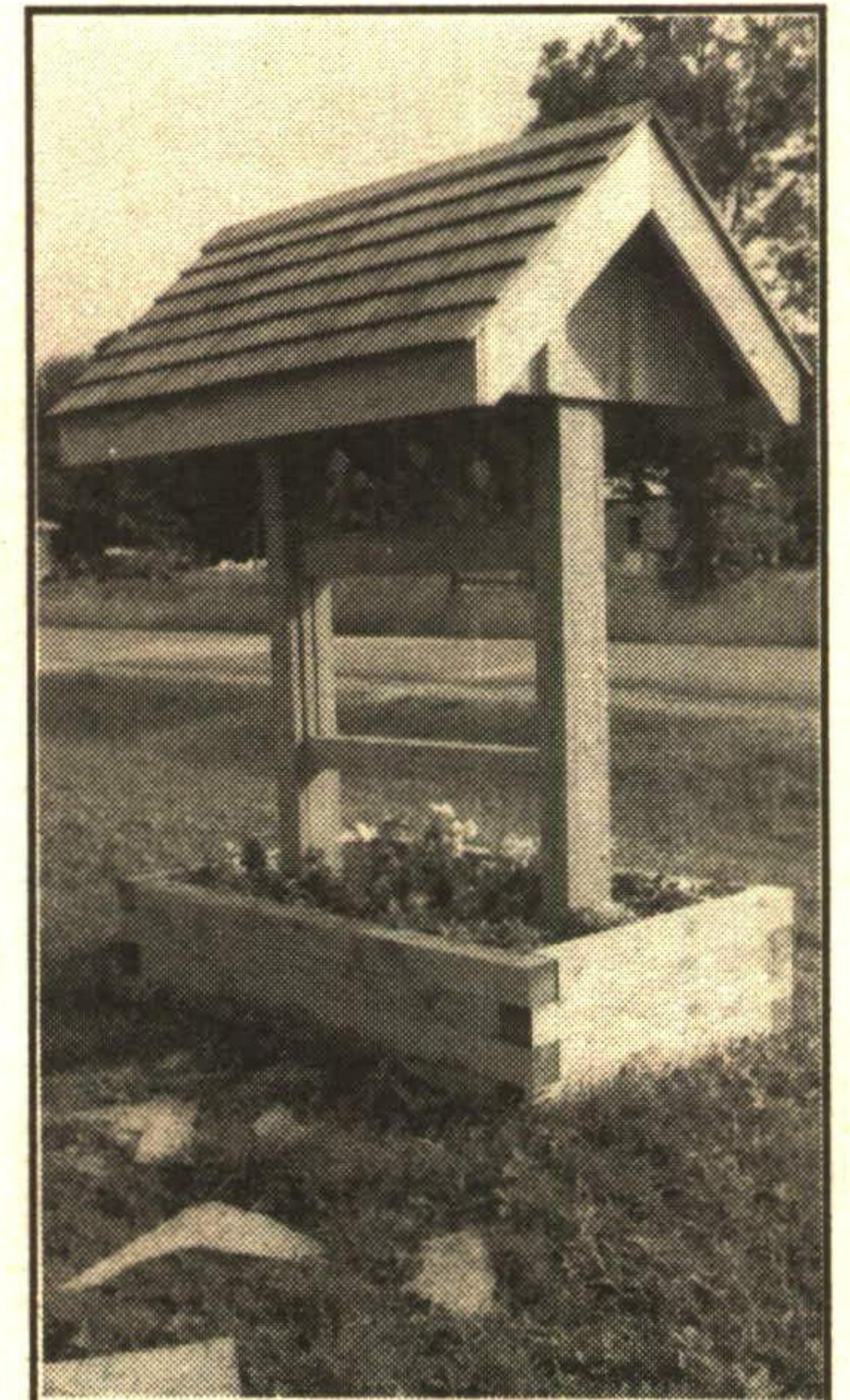
