## A 'Classic' success

Even though it rained on their parade, organizers of Sunday's Classics Against Cancer Car Show at Cedarvale Park managed to gather between \$13,000 to \$15,000 to donate to the Canadian Cancer Society for their efforts.

"We haven't got all the figures in yet," said organizer Neil Young, "But we're sure it's in that area. I'm sure, given good weather, we could have easily doubled that amount.

"The number of entries wasn't affected by the weather as much as expected," says Neil, "We had 235 cars enter this year, which was only down by about 25 from previous years. And most the people who didn't exhibit had really old cars with wood on them, so they didn't want them to get wet."

Neil was "very happy" with the support his committee received from numerous volunteers, both individuals and corporate sponsors. Valvoline oils and UAP auto products were quite generous and the committee managed to gather together more than 40 judges to score the numerous entries in 20 different categories.

"I was really pleased with the turnout, considering the cold wet day," said Neil. "In the morning, I was a little concerned with the attendance, but by 2:30 the people started coming in and we were really swamped."

Attendance figures were affected by the weather however, with around 2,000 people making their way through the gate this year, while previous years saw more than 2,400 visitors.

Neil also recognized the help the committee received from the Town of Halton Hills, making the cleanup much easier.


Numerous winners took home their prizes, with a first, second and third placing in each category.
