## Need help?

Letter carriers will keep an eye open for your well being as a free service. Mail or newspapers left at your door/mailbox or some other unusual appearance at your residence will signal the letter carrier that you may require assistance. This will be reported to Acton Social Services who will make sure that you receive assistance.

Who is eligible? Senior citizens living in the town of Acton or surrounding area. Disabled persons living in this area. All households



including apartments receiving door to door or rural postal delivery. Anyone in need of assistance living in this area.

How to register: During the next few weeks applications will be

delivered to your home. To be part of this program, you must fill out the application form and return it to the letter carrier or to Acton Social Services. Even if you have applied before it is important to do so again to update the file.
