## Blockbuster Video offers free Kidprint service

A free child safety program will be offered at southwestern Ontario Blockbuster Video stores, including Georgetown's store at 302 Guelph St., this July as a public service.

Kidprint is a new safety program in which children's images, voices and mannerisms are recorded on video tape.

"We don't claim to have the solution to the problem of missing children," said Debbie Adams, marketing manager, "but we hope Kidprint will help people become more aware of the increasing need for child safety. And if the program helps locate even one missing child, it will have more than served its purpose."

During scheduled Kidprint times (2-7 p.m.) every day during July, parents with children under 12 may take them to participating Blockbuster Video stores and have the children videotaped free.

Parents can supply their own 1/2" VHS tapes or may purchase them with proceeds going to Child Find Canada, Inc.

Kidprints may help locate and identify children who are later kidnapped or disappear. Thousands of cases of missing children are registered every year with the RCMP national registry of missing children.

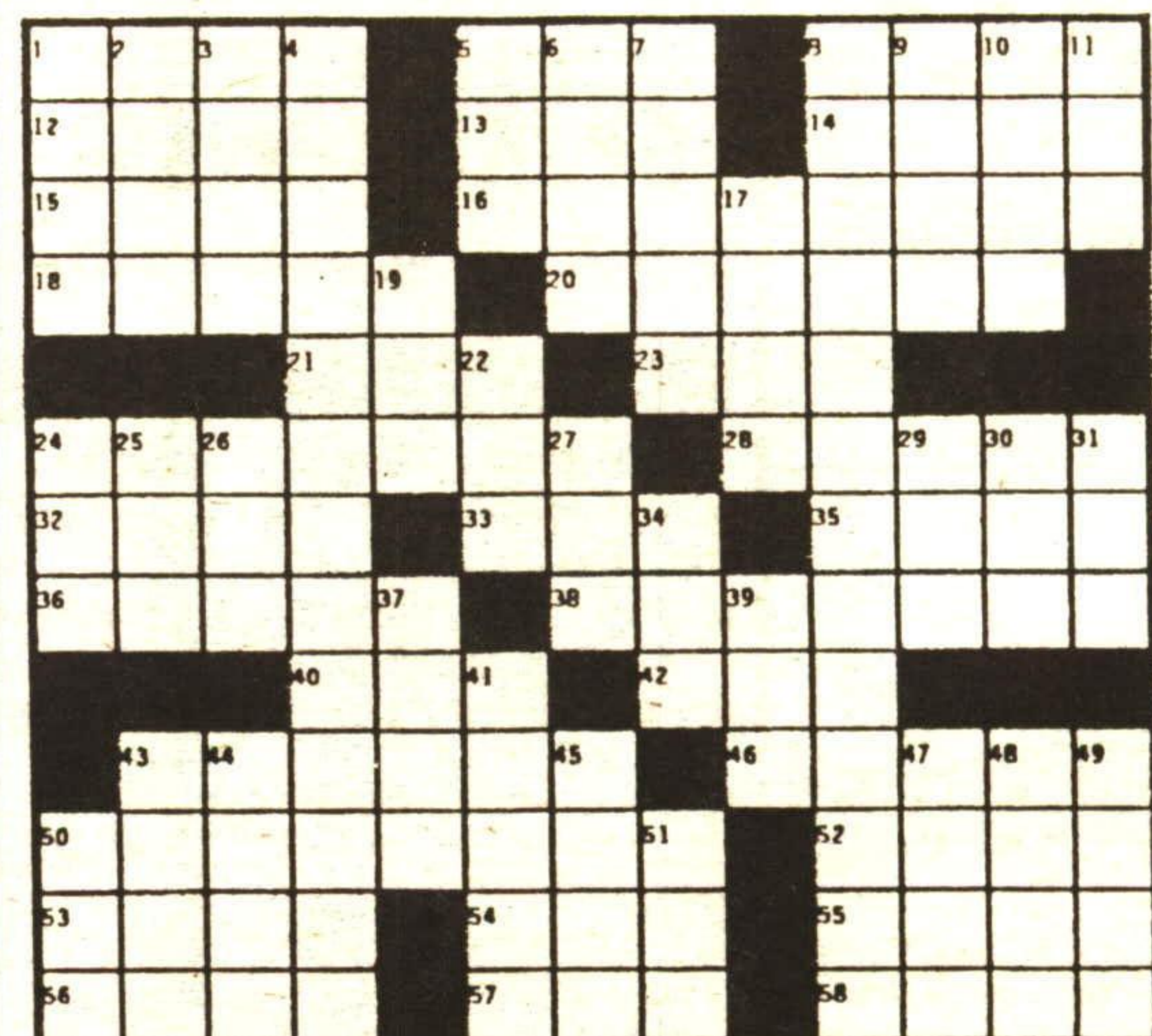

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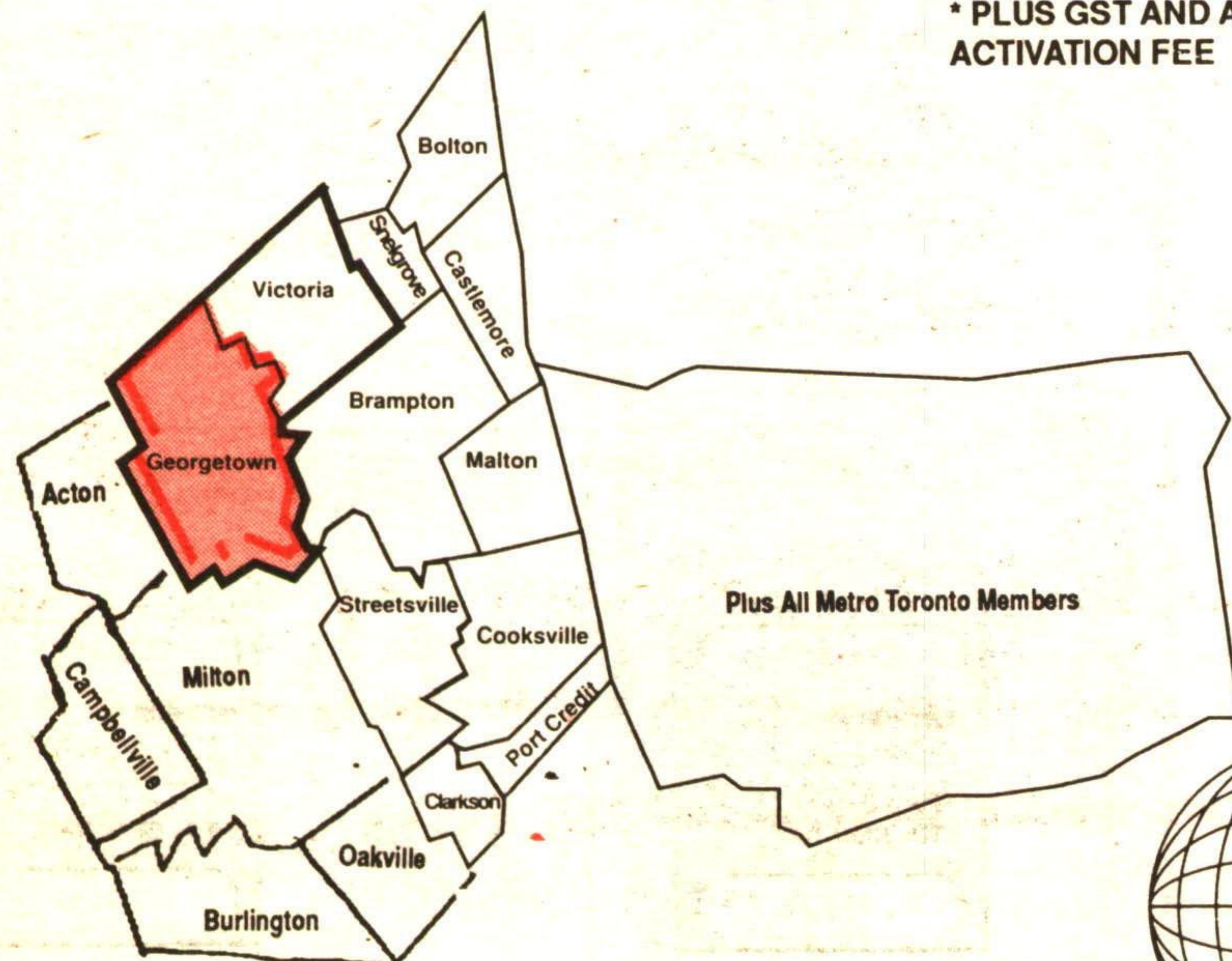
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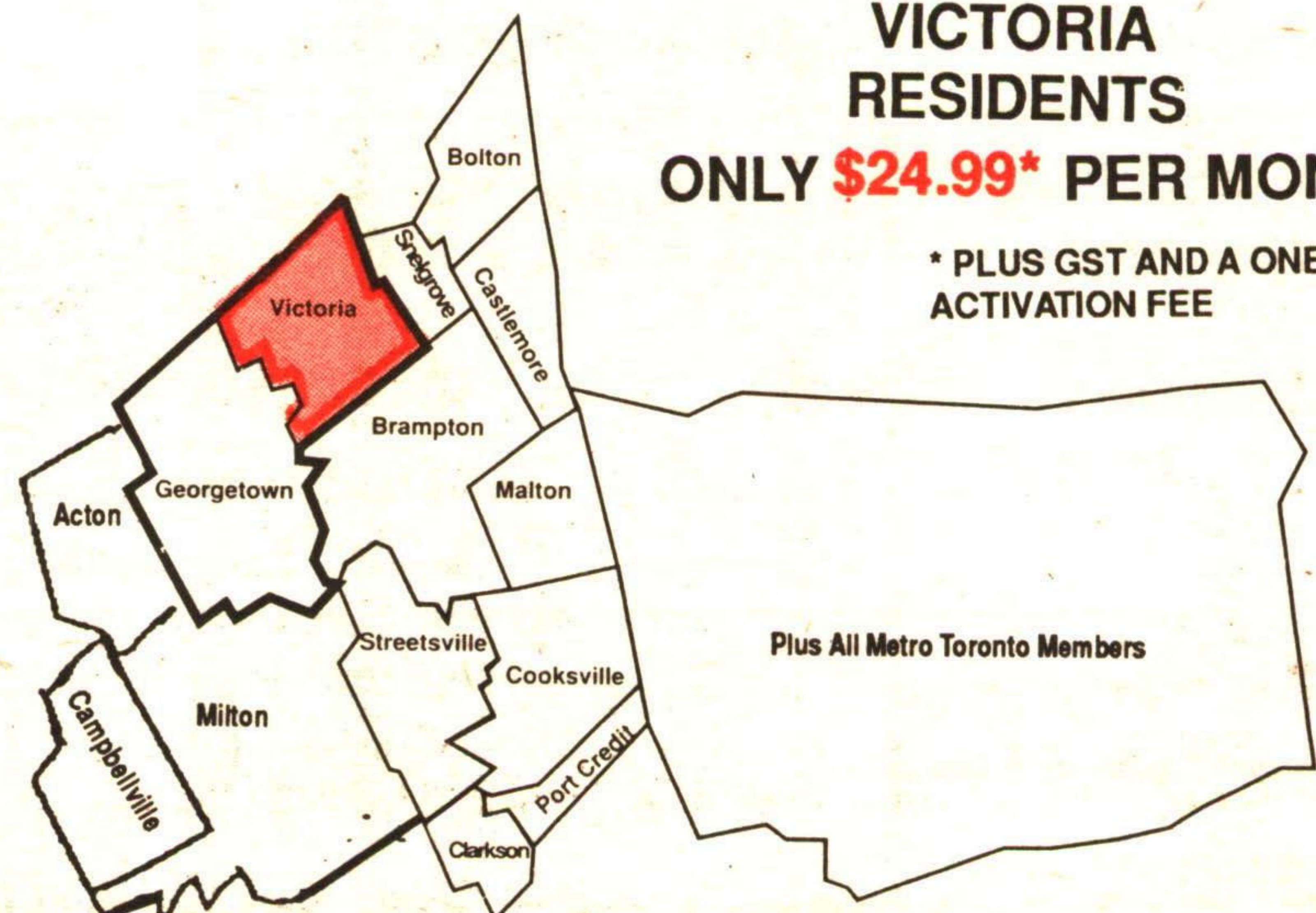
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
