





# Gertrude Porter celebrates centenary

resident for many years, celebrated her 100th birthday March 24.

Mrs. Porter, says granddaughter Tracy, has experienced a remarkable century; Nana as she's called, was born in Kingston in 1892 before the automobile had even been

invented! Mrs. Porter often reminisces, Tracy says, about her courting days, describing how her fiance picked her up in a carriage drawn by two horses and going for rides along Bloor Street in Toronto.

Mrs. Porter has lived through two world wars. During WWII, between 1939 and 1945, she was president of the Women's Auxiliary of the Boulevard Club. Her group of women "adopted" a Canadian naval corvette and supplied the sailors

gloves and sweaters during the war. Due to this involvement and 75 years as a member, she was made an Honorary Life Member of the Boulevard Club and is still very proud of this honor.

Although Mrs. Porter has always been an avid bridge and cribbage player, her true passion is afternoon soap operas and Hockey Night in Canada.

On a lighter note, in the last 100 years, Mrs. Porter has actually seen the Leafs win a Stanley Cup and has taken the TTC when the fare was only five cents!

Mrs. Porter has continued to be active in most recent years. When she was 85, she appeared on radio with the late Gordon Sinclair on CFRB in a Dominion store commer-



This was because they were celebrating a special anniversary and they found she was one of their original customers at the first store at Yonge and St. Clair. A manager, who had worked as a young boy in the meat department at the original store, recognized her many years later when she was shopping.

At the age of 93 Mrs. Porter was again in the spotlight when she was asked to pose for a Shopper's Drug Mart photographic promotion as they needed someone to model as a grandmother. You may have seen her in the front windows of their stores or on the back panels of Toronto buses and streetcars.

Mrs. Porter has 15 grandchildren and 24 great-grandchildren scattered across Canada, Hawaii and California.
