## Professional inspections can easy you mind about purchasing a new home

Arranging for a professional home inspection prior to buying a property of any age may be a small price to pay for peace of

There is no such thing as the 'perfect home'. Problems arise with homes of any age, from one to 100 years.

However, very few problems are insurmountable. An educated purchaser, with or without the help of a qualified professional, can identify them.

These are just some of the problems you should look for, according to Bob Dunlop, of Carson, Dunlop and Associates, a home inspection firm.

If you are buying a home with an asphalt shingle roof, bear in mind the lifespan of

most shingles is between 10 to 15 years. When you're looking at a home in this age bracket, you should be aware of the fact that these shingles may be coming to the end of their life expectancy.

On an average home, the replacement cost ranges between \$2,000 to \$4,000, depending on the number of layers of shingles, the pitch or slope, and the size of the roof.

If the home that you're looking at was built in the mid 1960s to mid-1970s, chances are the home has aluminum wiring. Aluminum became a popular alternative to copper at a time when copper prices rose skyhigh. Although it's not a serious problem, the cost of modifications will range from \$500 to \$800.

Homes built earlier than 1950 may need to have their electrical wiring and/or service size upgraded because the number of circuits is inadequate or the service size too small.

Modern gas-fired, forced-air furnaces traditionally have a life expectancy of 20 to 25 years. When looking at homes in this age bracket, you may have to replace the furnace. Furnaces can cost anywhere between \$1,500 to \$2,500. If you are interested in a

high-efficiency furnace, add another \$1,000 on to the cost.

Common in homes which were built prior to 1950 were galvanized steel plumbing pipes. Since galvanized steel only lasts between 30 and 40 years, you may have to replace the piping at a cost of \$3,000 to \$4,000.

Another problem, which arose In the mid-1970s was the use of Urea Formaldehyde Foam Insulation (UFFI). Although UFFI was banned in Canada in December, 1980, the United States and Europe continued to use the substance. It has yet to be proven that UFFl is a carcinogenic. The most serious problems are structural in nature and can occur in homes of any age. These problems can vary in magnitude and cost as much as

> \$100,000 to correct. For instance, a portion of the home can settle more than another. If this is the case, it will involve underpinning to prevent further

You know you have a problem with termites when

you find shelter tubes or mud tunnels which travel up your foundation walls and stop at floor joists. Since termites can't expose their bodies to air for fear of dehydration, those tube-like tunnels, the width of a pencil, are tell-tale signs. In finished basements, these tunnels are much harder to detect.

Among the biggest problems of all, says Dunlop, are wet basements. Every house has the potential for leakage in the basement. There are precautions which will reduce or prevent leakage, including good eavestroughing, downspouts, and grading that slopes away from the building. Inside fix-ups are really just 'putting your finger in the dyke'.

Make an effort to keep everything in perspective. All homes have problems. Problems shouldn't deter you from buying a home because many can be rectified at little cost. However, forewarned is forearmed.
