Real estate market has a language of its own

Did you realize that when buying a home you should make certain it has 'ELFs' and 'CAC' is very desirable?

As in any other field, real estate has evolved a language of its own. Familiarizing yourself with the language used to describe residential real estate will increase your knowledge of home buying and selling. You'll know that ELFs are electric light fixtures and CAC is central air conditioning.

With an understanding of real estate terms, you can approach

house hunting with more confidence and make the process easier and more comfortable.

Abbreviations used to describe home features vary from province to province and even from one real estate board to another.

For instance, a home built for two or more families in Vancouver or Calgary is called a 'multi' for multiple unit, while in the Toronto area, the same type of building is referred to as a 'duplex', 'triplex' or even 'sixplex'.

If you see in a listing that a

home has a "MB, WICC, ensuite," it helps to know that this means the master bedroom has a walk-in clothes closet and an ensuite.

Main rooms are abbreviated, so that dining room becomes DR, and bedroom BR. Bathrooms are described as two, three, four or fivepiece; or powder room, half bath or full bath. A two-piece bath or powder room usually has only a toilet and a sink, while a four-piece or full bath includes sink, toilet, shower and bathtub.

If a bathroom is referred to as

'R/I' that means it's roughed in and only the plumbing pipes are installed, not the fixtures, partitions and drywall. 'Roughed-in' can also be used when describing fireplaces or intercoms.

Extras in many homes can include broadloom W/L (where laid), a B/I dishwasher (built-in), D & S (drapes and sheers), S & S (storms and screens) etc.

Forced air gas heating (FAG) is a desirable feature in many cases, since the duct work used in this kind of heating doubles as the carrier of central air conditioning. FAO is forced air oil heating.

ISIT CRABGRASS

So you think you have crabgrass in your lawn? Don't be so sure. The weed grass may be something even worse...... Quackgrass.

Quackgrass is extremely vigorous, taller, faster growing and lighter green than desirable lawn grasses. Quackgrass has a broad, thick grass blade and a tough, wiry network of underground stems. It is commonly found in flower beds, however it can create serious problems in your lawn if not controlled. With its underground stems, it can spread over your entire lawn.

When in your lawn it usually grows sporadically through the lawn, but it can also grow in a thick clump. Since there is no selective weed control material for Quackgrass, the best method of controlling and/or suppressing the Quackgrass is to "stunt it out" or "crowd it out". This is accomplished by regularly fertilizing to help thicken the desired grasses. In addition, the lawn should be mowed at 2 inches and more frequently. This will help to "stunt" the Quackgrass while encouraging the desirable grasses.

If the Quackgrass is growing in a clump, one of 2 control methods can be used. Digging out the quackgrass to a depth of 4 inches, then replacing the-soil with good topsoil, then seeding or sodding to finish it off. The second method would be to treat the patch of Quackgrass with a Registered vegetation Control product (these can be purchased at your local nursery). Remember to read and follow the directions carefully. After 10 days, vigorously rake out the dead grass, seed directly on top of the dead Quackgrass and keep moist for 30 days.
