

Laura is looking for a home



Laura needs a home.

Families needed: while very few infants are available for adoption today, the Halton Children's Aid Society does have several older children who are looking for families.

One of these is Laura (not her real name), an appealing four-year-old with cerebral palsy. Laura had little stimulation during her first year or so, but has made quite dramatic progress since that time

While she does not speak, she is quite good at communicating with a special board and understands sign language as well. She stands well, but doesn't walk, and scoots around on her bottom to get where she wants to go. Recently, Laura has begun using a wheelchair and can ride her specially-adapted tricycle on her own.

Laura attends a regular nursery school where she takes part in all the activities and interacts very well with the other children.

Even though it can be a challenge for her to feed or dress herself, Laura persists until she accomplishes it. She's a lively, happy child (although she does have occasional temper tantrums when she gets frustrated), who loves music, outdoor play, and the million-and-one activities that most four-year-olds enjoy. She's also very affectionate, but a bit shy with new people.

Although Laura's health is excellent, she does attend therapy sessions on a regular basis to help her develop speech and physical coordination.

Because of Laura's special needs, she would fit best into a family where there are no children close to her in age or younger. Older children, however, might be helpful.

Several other schoolage children, both boys and girls, are also looking for adoptive families. These children have no physical disabilities but have experienced some trauma and difficulties in their earlier years.
