Know what you want before signing sale agreement

You may have been hunting for a new home for a long time. You're familiar with model homes, can handle the enthusiastic sales people and know exactly what features you're looking for in a home.

But now that you've settled on the one you want, you're into unfamiliar territory of agreements, offers and mortgages.

The Greater Toronto Home Builders' Association notes that a few cautions in this area are important.

There is a standard 'agreement

of purchase and sale' which is used by most home builders, real estate brokers and lawyers. Read the preprinted standard clauses as well as additional material.

Know and have stipulated exactly what the builder is to supply and install.

Determine exactly what the purchase price includes. This should be spelled out in the schedule attached to your agreement of purchase and sale.

This is especially important if you are buying from a model home

which is sometimes decorated with features which are not included in the standard product but have been incorporated for display purposes in model homes.

A careful review of the schedule detailing specifications will help you to determine extras which are not included in the standard purchase price. When you have done all this, read the document again.

When you make and offer and sign a contract, you can't refuse to accept the terms set down on its pages.

So do not sign the offer in haste: make sure you fully understand all aspects of the offer.

The offer may be in the form of a reservation, conditional offer or a firm offer and should indicate a closing date.

A written contract stipulates that the vendor agrees to sell his property and the purchaser agrees to buy it at an agreed-upon price. The offer to purchase binds both parties to the terms and conditions within, if accepted. Be certain that your offer to purchase accurately

reflects your wishes, that all details are accurate - names spelled correctly, special conditions clearly defined, mortgage information properly stated - because your offer is your obligation.



LAWNS AND TREES

Each has its own characteristics. There are many varieties of grasses. Some are tolerant of drought and disease, while others need plenty of water' and tender loving care. Grass grows naturally in the sun, however some varieties do very well in the shade.

When planted properly and in a good location, trees become an important part of the landscape around your home. As the trees mature, the grass must cope with the environmental change surrounding the lawn. Trees compete with a lawn for water, nutrients and light. Watering deeply under trees will encourage deep tree roots which will be less likely to compete with the lawn for water, and reduce mowing difficulties. It is important that fertility and a minimum cutting height of 2 1/2" be maintained on lawns which are grown under trees. Proper and regular pruning of shade trees will improve air circulation, thereby controlling disease and moss in your lawn. Leaves or grass clippings should not be allowed to accumulate under trees which will smother the turf.

Grass types, such as Chewing Fescue and certain varieties of Kentucky Bluegrass grow quite well in the shade. If sod or seed is laid in shady areas, it will normally grow quite well for the first 1 - 2 years. However, as the grass adjusts to the shady environment, certain varieties will die off. If this occurs, additional shade seed may be required to keep the lawn thick and lush. Lawns and trees provide a beautiful setting but some thought and work must go into the culture of both of them together.


