Small claims courts expect to get busier

Anyone in Ontario can now sue for claims of up to \$3,000 instead of the previous \$1,000 in small claims

This brings the rest of the province in line with Toronto, which has had a \$3,000 limit since 1980. The claims across the province will be increased to \$6,000 starting April 1, 1993.

The aim is to make the court more accessible for everyone in the province, from the average person with a claim for faulty repairs, to the small business owner trying to collect a bill. Small claims court is especially important to small business owners and average consumers during difficult economic times.


"It's a cheaper, quicker, and an equally effective way," of resolving claims, Jeff Steinburg, the executive director of the Halton Hills Community Legal Clinic said, adding the change will help people, because it will reduce court costs. People can launch or defend their own suits concerning money, debt and property damages without hiring a lawyer in Small Claims Court.

"I think it's a terrific idea," confirmed Terry Jackson, manager of the Halton Hills Chamber of Commerce. "I called a couple of businesses, and they said that when it was over \$1,000, then the lawyers' fees were sometimes more money than they got" from the claim.

Provincial statistics show that demand for small claims court will increase 25 per cent during the first year, and an additional 15 per cent after limits are increased to \$6,000.

Before the increased to \$6,000, the government will consult with court users, the judiciary and lawyers on ways to make the small claims court system more responsive and efficient. This includes considering how to improve the service and ensuring that standards and proce-

dures are suitable to a people's court. In order to cover increased court costs, court fees will be raised, but they will be less for lower claims. The exact amount of fees has not yet been released yet.


