Decision disappoints EAGLE

suggested the MOE prevent the quarry
from expansion because portions of the
southerly property are environmentally
sensitive.

EAGLE hoped Grier could either stop the expansion or at least restrict UAL's quarrying licence. Grier rejected an environmental assessment because UAL was granted a license in 1972, before the EAA was established in 1977.

"The EAA does not allow for the designation of private sector projects begun before the act was established...unless there has been a significant change in a project," the release concluded. Grier promised that the Ministry of Natural Resources will monitor UAL's activities "to guarantee sound environmental planning and reduced environmental impacts."

Halton north MPP Noel Duignan is expected to announce Monday "a cooperative way to ensure all environmental conditions are enforced," he said. Further details were not available at

EAGLE's Pat Woode said she was "disappointed" with Grier's decision, but admitted she "wasn't surprised." EAGLE is also arguing UAL's licence, which was renewed in 1990, is not legal because quarrying was allowed to expand from 150 acres to its present-day 575 acres without "proper public hearings.

"We've always asked how UAL got its licence in the first place," Woode said. "We're still of the opinion that the operations have not gone through the proper channels."

Halton Region's solicitor Mark Meneray said Friday he is also questioning the legality of UAL's licence, and expects a confidential report to council in late fall.

EAGLE is waiting for the Niagara Escarpment Commission to process an amendment that would redesignate portions of UAL's southerly lands from extraction to natural and protection. NEC senior planner Marion Plaunt said a report is expected within the next four to six months.
