Court decision appealed

The appeal of the sentence handed a Milton girl involved in last year's car crash which claimed the life of 16-year-old Carly MacNeil has been scheduled for September 10.

Halton Crown Attorney Laurie Jago made a request for the appeal in April after Judge James Fuller ruled a jail term was unnecessary for the girl who was co-driving the standard transmission car from the front console when the single vehicle accident occurred last year.

Open custody is being sought for the 18-year-old who pleaded guilty to criminal negligence causing death and was sentenced in March to three years probation and ordered to perform 150 hours of community service work.

Judge Fuller said in his 17 years behind the bench he had never seen two young offenders with such high academic achievements and backing from the community.

A Grade 11 E.C. Drury High School student, Carly died June 13 last year when the car she and five other teens were riding in hit a hydro pole and overturned on Five Sideroad. She was thrown from the vehicle.

Celebrating the end of the school year, the group of friends were on their way home from Emerald Lake

- a popular Flamborough swimming and picnic area.

Before leaving on the excursion, the youths approached a young adult to buy liquor for them. Accompanied by a 12-pack of beer and six pre-mixed alcoholic beverages, the teens drove to the lake at about 1 p.m.

But when it was time to come home, the girl, who had borrowed her parents' car for the day, informed her friends she had too much to drink and couldn't drive.

Instead, she operated the vehicle's clutch, gas, brake, and stick shift from the console while another youth, who pleaded guilty to dangerous driving in the case, steered.

The four other passengers, including Carly, sat in the back

The teens had been driving for about 15 minutes when the driver sitting on the console decided to pass a car full of friends travelling ahead of them. She pulled the wheel and accelerated, causing the car to go out of control.

Because the girl was 17 at the time of the accident, her identity is protected under the Young Offenders Act.

The hearing will take place at the Ontario Court of Appeal in Toronto.

Cigarette thefts

Police are investigating two break and enters that occurred in Georgetown early Monday morning. The first occurred at a Trafalgar Rd. gas station/variety store. Police responded to an alarm at the store, and upon their arrival discovered the front door was wide open and broken glass was found on the floor. Police suspect a metal chair was used to smash the door. An unknown quantity of cigarettes was stolen.

The other break-in occurred at a variety store on Mountainview Rd. Police say that an area resident heard people outside at about 1:30 a.m. The witness told police that two young males (estimated to be about 15-years-old) got out of a dark mid-size car, went to the front window of the store, and broke it. They then reached in and stole cigarettes.

Peace sign painted

Police report that just before 2 a.m. Wednesday a resident of the Eighth Line discovered a large peace sign painted on the road north of 22 Sideroad. The man spotted a vehicle parked up the road, drove up to it, and found no one in it. Police say he returned to the painting and saw someone jump over a fence and run into the woods. The vehicle fled the scene shortly after.

Car and foot chase

A 23-year-old Georgetown man and a 24-year-old Toronto man were charged with possession of property obtained by crime following a car and foot chase in Georgetown early Monday morning. 
