Wide open green space is allure of Canada for visiting Japanese

According to 31 visiting Japanese girls, Georgetown is a wonderful place to be.

The girls, aged 15 to 17, are visiting from Hiroshima for three weeks with a non-profit educational exchange program called Cultural Homestay International.

The girls have each been placed with a host family and have divided their time between studying English language and Canadian culture and sightseeing. They depart today, Sunday.

The girls are taught and organized by Judith Gooding, an English teacher at Georgetown

District High School, and Linda Walton, a management consultant and writer.

Gooding and Walton are pleased with the exchange, saying it has been a lot of hard work but very rewarding.

Host "Mom" Fran Anthony is thrilled to have been involved with the exchange. "They're a delight," said Anthony, who goes everywhere she can with the students.

The girls have sampled a variety of Canadian experiences, including a Kitchener farm market, Toronto, Canada's Wonderland, a nature walk and even lawn bowling

with Georgetown's seniors!

Surprisingly, Ayano Tanaka said her favorite place so far is not the CN Tower or Skydome but the "open green space" in Canada. Tanaka said Japan does not have many open spaces.

Japan and Canada's educational systems are similar, said Tanaka, and one of her dreams is to be involved in TV production.

She noted that there are many Japanese cars in Canada, that groceries are inexpensive here in comparison to her homeland but that other products like perfume and clothing are about the same.
