Locals earn bronze at World Baton finals

In their international debut, the Georgetown Kings East Baton Twirling Club's senior team put forth an outstanding performance and captured the bronze medal at the 1992 World Baton Twirling Championships in Paris, France August 5-9.

The local team, which is headed up by Georgetown coaches Darlene and Tim King, won the gold at the Canadian National finals in Newmarket in July — earning them the right to compete at the World Championships.

In their best performance to date, the Kings squad upset the Italian team (who have been in the top three for many years) and won the bronze in the final round of competition.

The local team came away with the fewest number of drops, three, of any team this year

and received tremendous fan support from the French audience for their five minute routine featuring a mixed version of music by the Pet Shop Boys (It's a Sin) and Pink Floyd (The Wall).

"It was a fabulous performance, especially since it was the team's first trip to the Worlds," said an elated Darlene King, "This certainly surpassed all our expectations. The team was just in tears after we were awarded the medals."

The Georgetown team placed third during the qualifying round on August 7 and were confident about their chances at capturing a medal before the final round began on August 9.

The team performed just before the French team, and Darlene says she was surprised at the great reception they received from the crowds.

King's squad were edged out of second place, by a very slim margin, by a U.S. team and Japan captured the gold. Also qualifying for the

finals were teams from England and France. A total of 14 teams from across the globe competed at the Worlds this year.

Georgetown teen Susan Thibodeau, 18, was a member of the medal winning squad. She has been with the team for two years and has been baton twirling for seven.

"I'm very happy," said Susan, who will be studying to be a legal assistant at Humber College this fall, "This was our first year at the world championships and we're all just so happy."

The senior team's other members include Kevan Lactrace, Alison Brown, Theresa Baumgarter, Tracy Doiron, Shantelle Acterson, Dana Jenkins, Crissy Power, Gail McGrath, Debbie van Rysselt, Karen Hunt and Dee Ann Sequillion.


