

# Pomeroy may launch civil suit after Project 80 probe completed

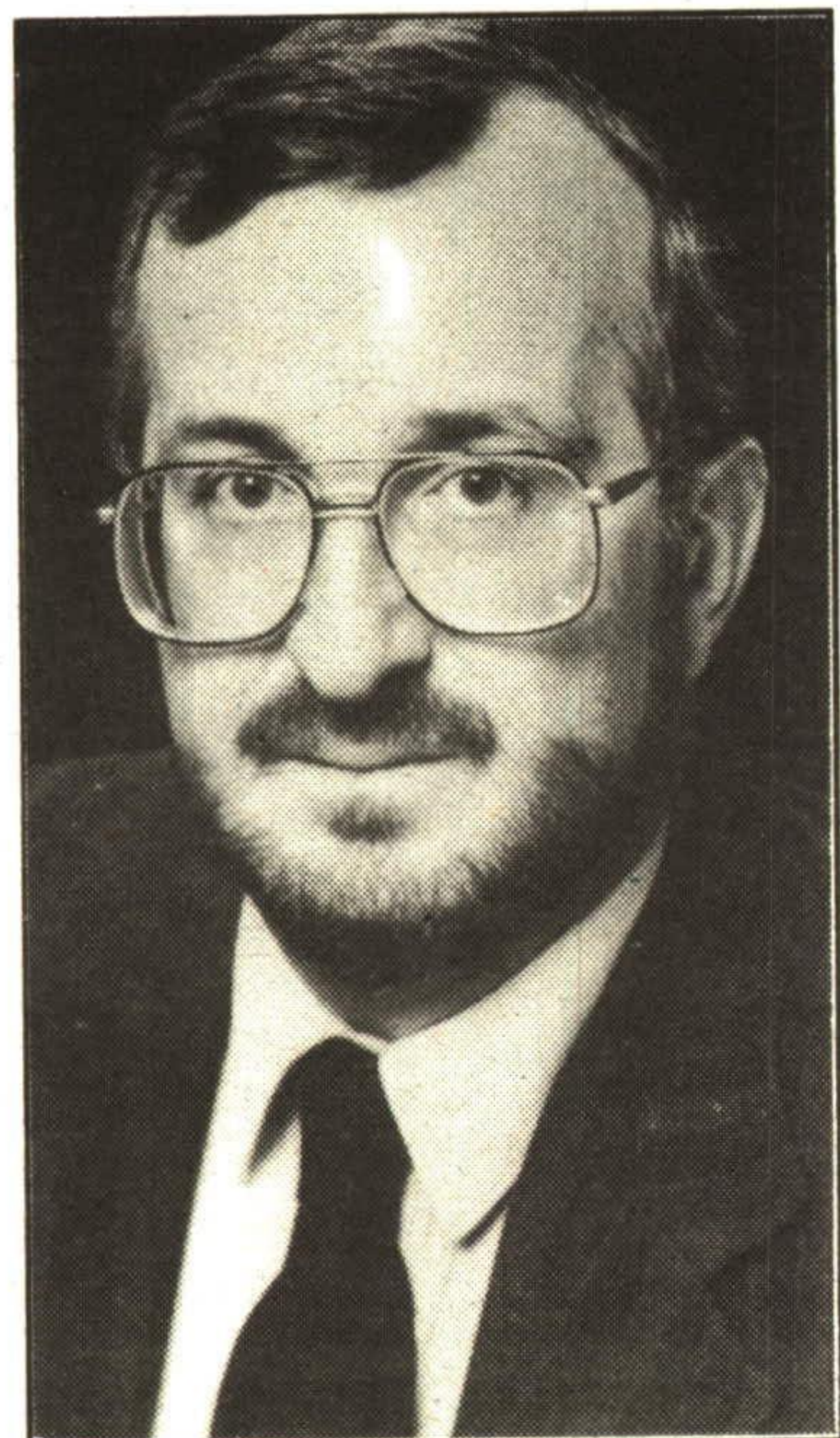

 "I have no idea who they have interviewed, if they have at all," Pomeroy said.

"I've had no discussions with anyone who has been interviewed, except one member of council who said he was approached by the officers. They've interviewed me once, back last November, and that's been it....They have to complete their investigation, and they probably won't make any statements until it's concluded. That's the fair way for all of us."

When asked if he believed those being investigated will be exonerated at the probe's conclusion, Pomeroy replied, "yes, as far as I know."

However, when pressed, he reaffirmed his pre-election statements made last fall after the investigation was made public, that he will be demanding an apology from those responsible for launching the probe in the first place. He also warned that he will "probably" file a civil slander suit.

"Yes, I'm still angry about all this, but my position on this hasn't

changed, and it won't change," he said Wednesday. "I told you my

position a long time ago, and it has not changed, period...I feel exactly the same way now, but I think we'll all feel better when it is concluded....I have no problem with the investigation itself, but I do have a problem with the people who are driving it. I realize the officers have a job to do, and that's fine."

Late last October, Pomeroy read a prepared statement at the last council meeting before the municipal election, warning that "those responsible" for initiating the investigation will be made known in the end.

"I am fully aware of all the names and all the individuals in this sad campaign," he said at the time. "Those who are elected, those who hope to be and those who work with them — those names will come out in the investigation..."

He also hinted that Halton north MPP Noel Duignan and his employees are also involved in the controversy, but at the time Duignan said he felt "honor-bound" not to respond until the probe has concluded.
