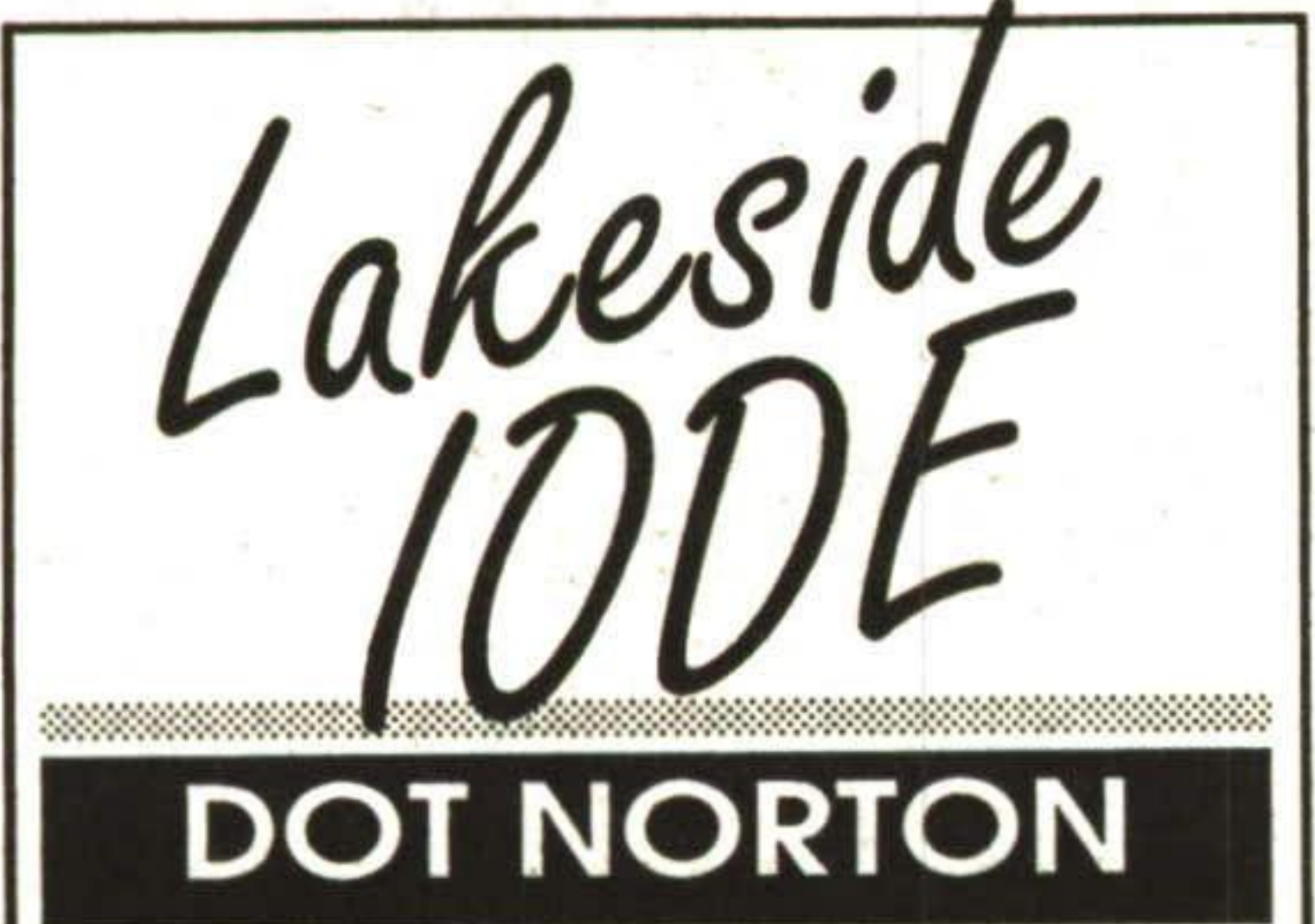


IODE readies for fall season
