# Halton Hills taxes to go up

Continued from page 1 Under the current system, taxes are based on the assessed value of the home in each municipality, but that assessment isn't equal across Halton.

With MVA, homes of similar worth, regardless of whether they are in Georgetown or Burlington, will be taxed roughly the same amount.

Each of the four municipalities in Halton currently have their own version of MVA in place, but each use a different year to assess the level of taxes. Halton Hills uses 1980, Milton 1975, while Burlington and Oakville are based on 1984.

MVA supporters argue to use the same base year is a fair way to equalize taxes throughout the region, so that every business and homeowner pay their share equally.

However, its opponents argue the figures are based on average assessments, and therefore do not accurately reflect what the range of taxes will really be.

A report by Halton Hills treasurer Ray King concluded 86 per cent of homeowners in Acton will pay more taxes. Overall, 66 per cent of Halton Hills homeowners' taxes will increase. Homes and businesses in the municipalities' downtown cores will pay more money, as the assessed property values will increase.

That is essentially cutting the throat of the downtown businesses, some councillors argued, and might be the death of the same main street corridors that local governments have been trying to preserve.




