# Mark Aldridge named to Ontario juvenile golf squad



Georgetown teen Mark Aldridge is quickly becoming an accomplished competitor in the Ontario juvenile golf circuit. The youth has had some impressive performances at tournaments this summer and appears headed for even more suc-

Sixteen-year-old Mark, a grade 11 student at Georgetown District High School, was named to the Ontario Juvenile Boy's Golf Team this summer and had an impressive outing at the annual Ontario-Quebec Juvenile Golf Tournament, held this year at Sunningdale Golf Course in London, August 19 and 20.

Six juvenile golfers from both provinces (the top two from each age group: 14, 15, and 16) participated in this two day event. At the time Mark was 15 and came away with two wins and one loss for the tournament. He went up against the best juvenile golfers from central Canada and proved himself to be a top flight athlete.

Mark qualified for the provincial juvenile boy's golf team after tryouts at the Ontario Provincial Tournament in Barrie, July 21 to 23. Over 100 juvenile male golfers participated at these tryouts with only 45 making the squad. Mark finished in 10th spot of all male juvenile golfers competing.

He competed at about 20 golf tournaments this summer. Included in these were a first place showing on July 6 at a tournament at St.


George Golf Course in Toronto with a 74 score and a second place finish with a score of 73 at Springfield Golf Course in Eromosa June 25.

Cribbage players are being urged to join the fun at the Acton Legion each Thursday evening from 8 to 10 p.m.




Ball awards


The cost of the evening is \$10 per family. A pot luck supper will be served with 'A' to 'M' bringing a main dish while 'N' to 'Z' providing desserts.





Fortunately, head coach Charlie Hanman inked rear guards Justin Huminuck and Jason Parks to the team as well left winger Dean Doner, who comes to the squad from the Sheridan College Bruins last season.

Raiders' president Finn Poulstrup is also negotiating the release of defenceman John McKee (Raider left winger Todd McKee's older brother) from the Mimico Junior A team. The team is confident that the release will be finalized very shortly.

And with that said, let us introduce to you Georgetown Chrysler Raiders' 1992-93 lineup.

Between the pipes this season for the Junior A squad will be former Raider Jason Sirota, 20, who played Tier Two Junior A hockey in British Columbia last year, and 19year-old Jamie Szyc, who played Junior B hockey in Fort

Erie last season.

Hanman will be going with Sirota as the team's number one goalie this season. The netminder has a lot of quickness, has been strong in exhibition games this month, and will likely get the start for the Raiders this weekend against Burlington in the season open-

Veteran left winger Todd McKee, 19, and centre Trevor Brandt, 19, will hook up with new comer Randy Bond for one line this year. Georgetown right winger Bond, 17, comes to the team from the rep midget Halton Hurricanes squad last season.

19-year-old Returning Raiders Trevor Elinesky, on left wing, and centre Ian Ellis will skate along side former Acton Junior C Sabre Jim English. Twenty-year-old English was a scoring leader

for the Sabres last season on the right side and should be able to rack up the points again this year.

Injured Britton Taylor, 17, will likely be Georgetown's third centre this season. He will probably be hooked up with left winger Dean Doner, 19, and right winger Jonathan Levack, 17.

Taylor played rep midget hockey in Chinguacousy last year while Levack was a midget player in the Metro Toronto league.

At present, the Raiders are going with five defencemen: returning Raider Steve Weishar, 17-year-old Ante Galic, 16-year-old Jason Parks, 16-year-old Kevin Moxey, and 16-year-old Justin Huminuck.


Both Parks and Moxey from the Halton Hurricanes Major Bantam team last year while Galic played midget rep hockey in Mississauga and Huminuck hails from Newmarket.

"I think we should have a good team this year," said Hanman, "What we need to do is just play consistent hockey until the rookies get some experience and develop into stronger players."


Hanman explains that the team situation is a lot better than it was a week ago.

"This is a very hard working bunch of players, they're giving it their all every time they hit the ice."


With all this said and the exhibition contests finished, it's time for the real thing.




