Police search for gold Camaro

A Brampton woman made a report to Halton Regional Police saying was followed by a man in a Camaro while she was driving in Georgetown Wednesday night.

The information has been forwarded to the Green Ribbon Task Force which is investigating the murder of St. Catharines teen Kristen French. The Brampton woman, who was accompanied by another woman, says they were followed by a man driving a 1977-1981 Camaro when they turned off Hwy. 7 to visit a friend in the John and Victoria Sts. area at about 9:30 p.m. Wednesday.

Police say the two women attempted to lose the car but it followed them to the train yard. The


women reported the car stayed in the area when they made a stop at a nearby residence. The women say they couldn't see the licence number

The car is described as gold or bronze colored. The driver is described as clean-shaven with long dark hair which was feathered short at the front.

Police seek help in hit and run accident

The Halton Regional Police in Milton and Crime Stoppers of Halton are appealing to the public for information that will lead to the apprehension of two males involved in a hit and run accident on Britannia Road in August 1992.

On Aug. 24, at 7:50 a.m., a 46-year-old female subject was walking eastbound on Britannia Road just east of the Eighth Line in Milton. At this time two male subjects in a turquoise green, two door, newer model vehicle came alongside of the female and asked if she wanted a ride. The victim declined their offer a couple of times. As the suspects drove off the passenger opened the car door hitting the victim on the left side. She was knocked into the ditch causing



injuries to her head and face area.
The suspects did not stop to assist the injured women.

Description of suspects:

Driver - male, white, olive complexion, moustache, approximately 30 years.

Passenger - male, white, olive complexion, moustache, approximately 30 years, wearing a black t-shirt.

Boy charged

A 14-year-old Acton boy has been charged with sexual assault after a Milton girl reported being assaulted behind a Milton bank last Saturday night.

According to police, the 16year-old victim was waiting to meet friends in the rear of the building when the attack occurred at 7:45 p.m. When the girl's two friends went to meet

the victim, police said, they found her pinned to the ground by a youth who was sitting on top.

The victim was struggling, police said, and the girls helped push the boy away. The three girls then ran to the fairgrounds where the Milton Fall Fair was being held and reported the attack to police.

Police arrested the suspect at his home. He was held for a bail hearing Monday and was released. The boy, whose identity is protected under the Young Offenders Act, will appear in youth court October 16.

The victim and the suspect are acquaintances, police said.


