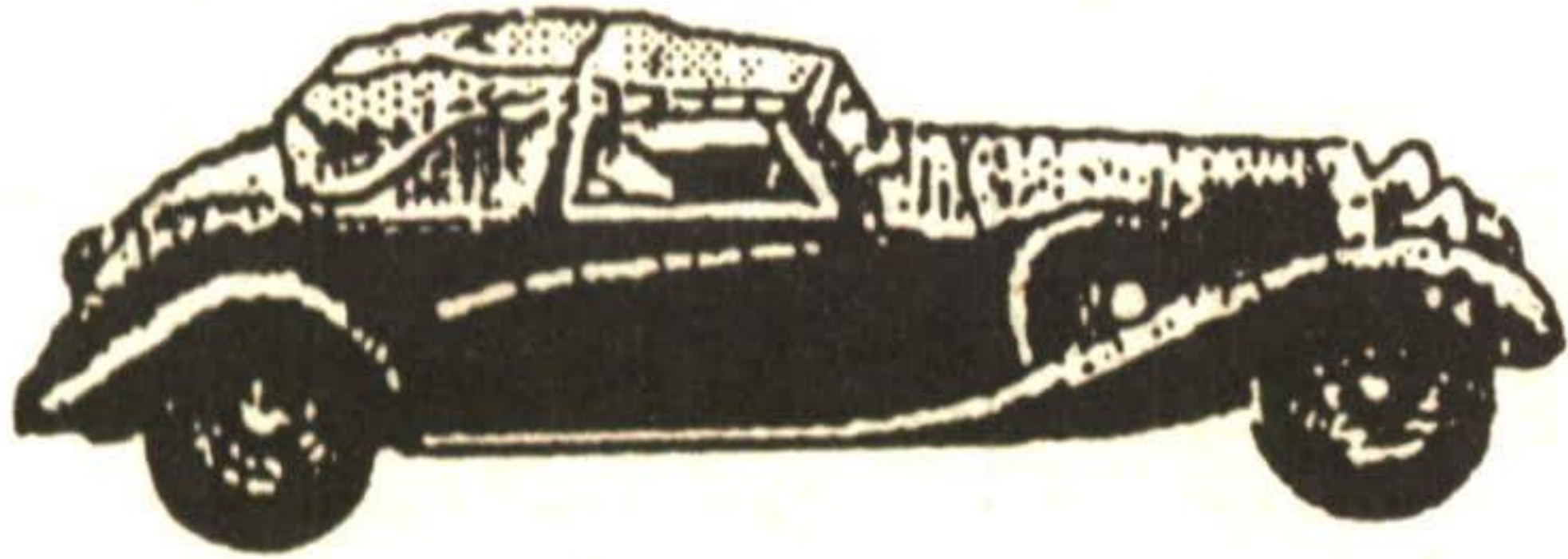

Enumerators begin registering voters

Sometime between now and Wednesday you can expect a knock on your door from an enumerator wearing a bright yellow badge.

Elections Canada, the non-partisan agency responsible for the conduct of the federal referendum to be held Oct. 26, has organized up to 143,000 workers in 220 electoral districts to ensure that some 13 million voters will be able to cast their ballots on the constitution question next month.

The 318 enumerators enlisted in Halton-Peel riding began registering voters for the federal referendum on Friday. They will finish on Wednesday.

From Thursday Oct. 8 to Monday Oct. 19 those who were missed during enumeration will have a chance to have their names added to the voters' list by going to their local returning office in Georgetown at

Early voting will be held in the Georgetown office from Monday, Oct. 12 to Friday, Oct. 17 and on Monday, Oct. 19 and Tuesday, Oct. 20. Voting in advance polls, one at M.Z. Bennett School in Acton and

two at Centennial School in Georgetown, will be held on Thursday and Friday Oct. 22 and 23. On Monday Oct. 26 the polls (40 of them in the riding) will be open from 9 a.m. to 8 p.m.

Voters will be told which poll they should vote at when they are enumerated.

Construction of Mountainview Rd. pathway expected to start in early November

Construction of the long-awaited path through Georgetown's Silver Creek Valley should finally begin early November — almost three months later than was originally planned.

Halton Hills' manager of engineering services Peter Linn gave a final work schedule to town councillors last week, which outlined when the path's construction is expected to start and finish.

Linn was responding to councillor Ron Chatten's demands from two weeks ago that definite construction dates be provided as soon as possible. Chatten was angry at the constant delays in the project, which he feared may bump it to

sometime next year.

Council and residents of the Georgetown south area are concerned about the dangers of walking or riding bikes along Mountainview Rd. through the valley while traffic is speeding by. They have insisted that a path away from the road be built immediately before a serious accident occurs.

According to Linn's schedule, the final design of the path, which will wind through the valley on the west side of Mountainview, should be completed sometime next week.

Approvals from the Credit Valley Conservation Authority and the ministry of natural resources are expected about four weeks after that, with construction to

start the first week of November.

The whole project should be finished by mid-December.

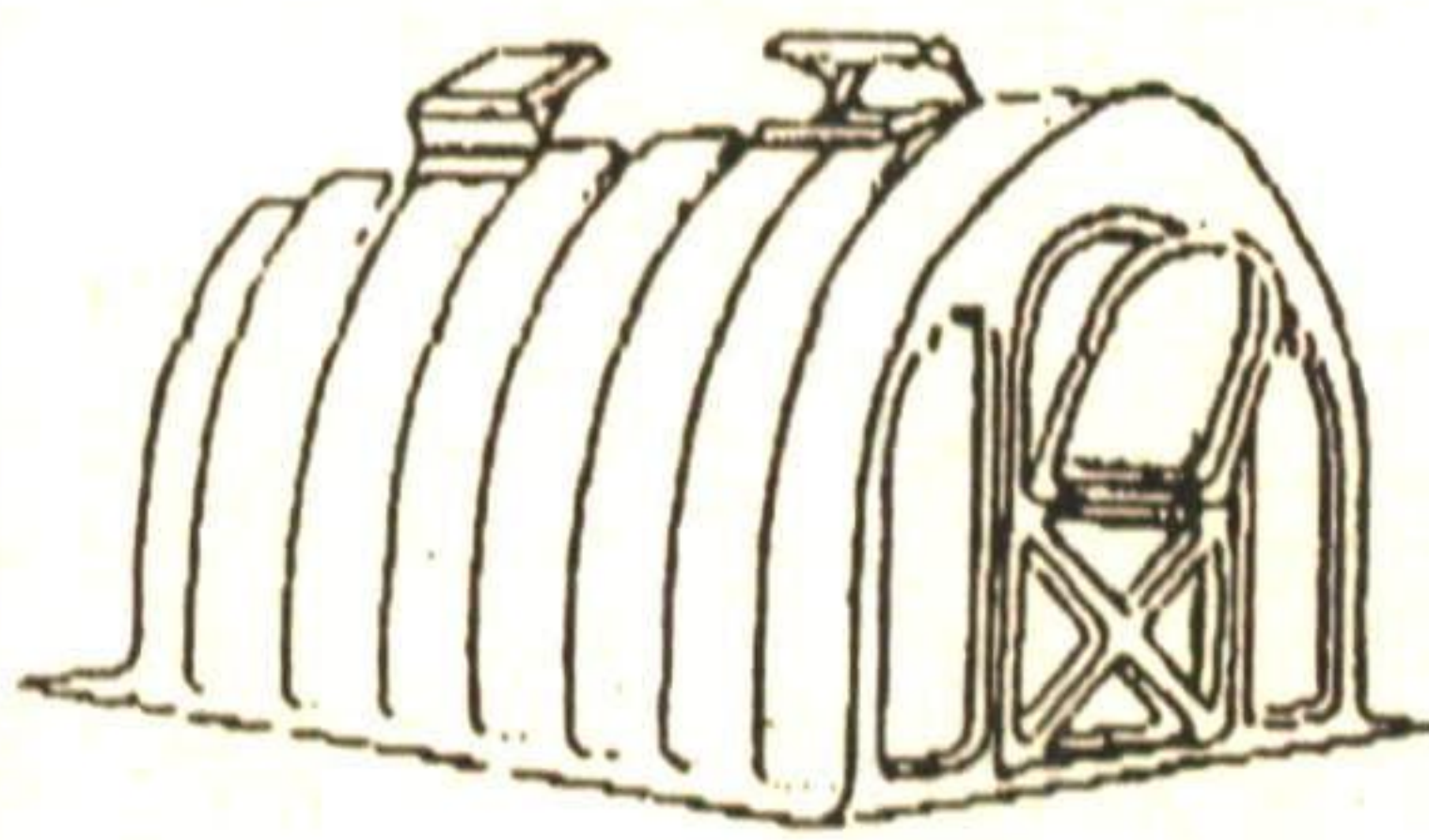
"I hope it's a mild December," Chatten quipped, inferring that the project may be jeopardized and delayed further because of bad weather conditions.

To appease council, a weekly update will be provided by the town's consultant to keep the local politicians abreast of the situation.

Originally, a short bridge across Silver Creek was to have been built by late August, with the rest of the path finished a few weeks later. But, delays in receiving the necessary permits and miscommunication between the town and the conservation authority kept stalling the project.
