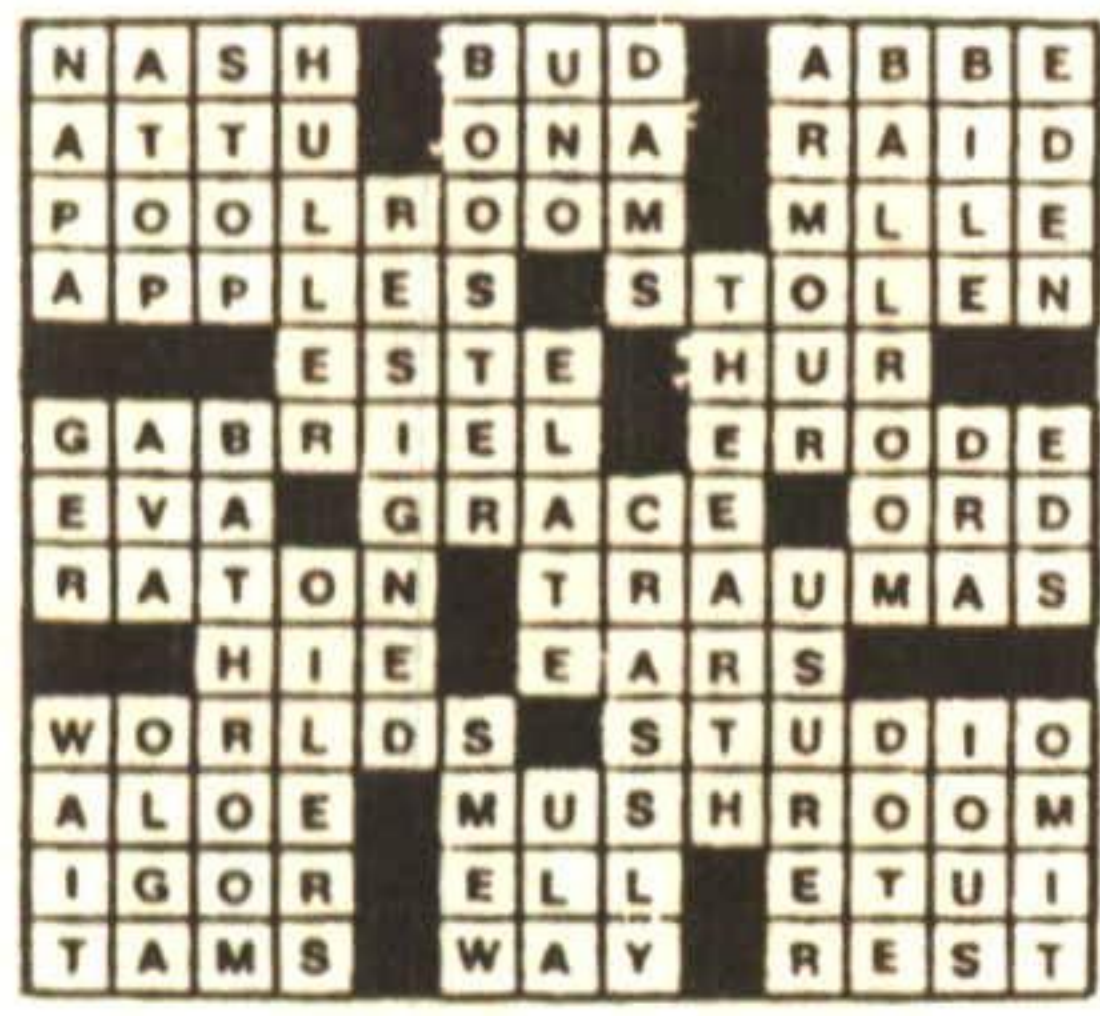

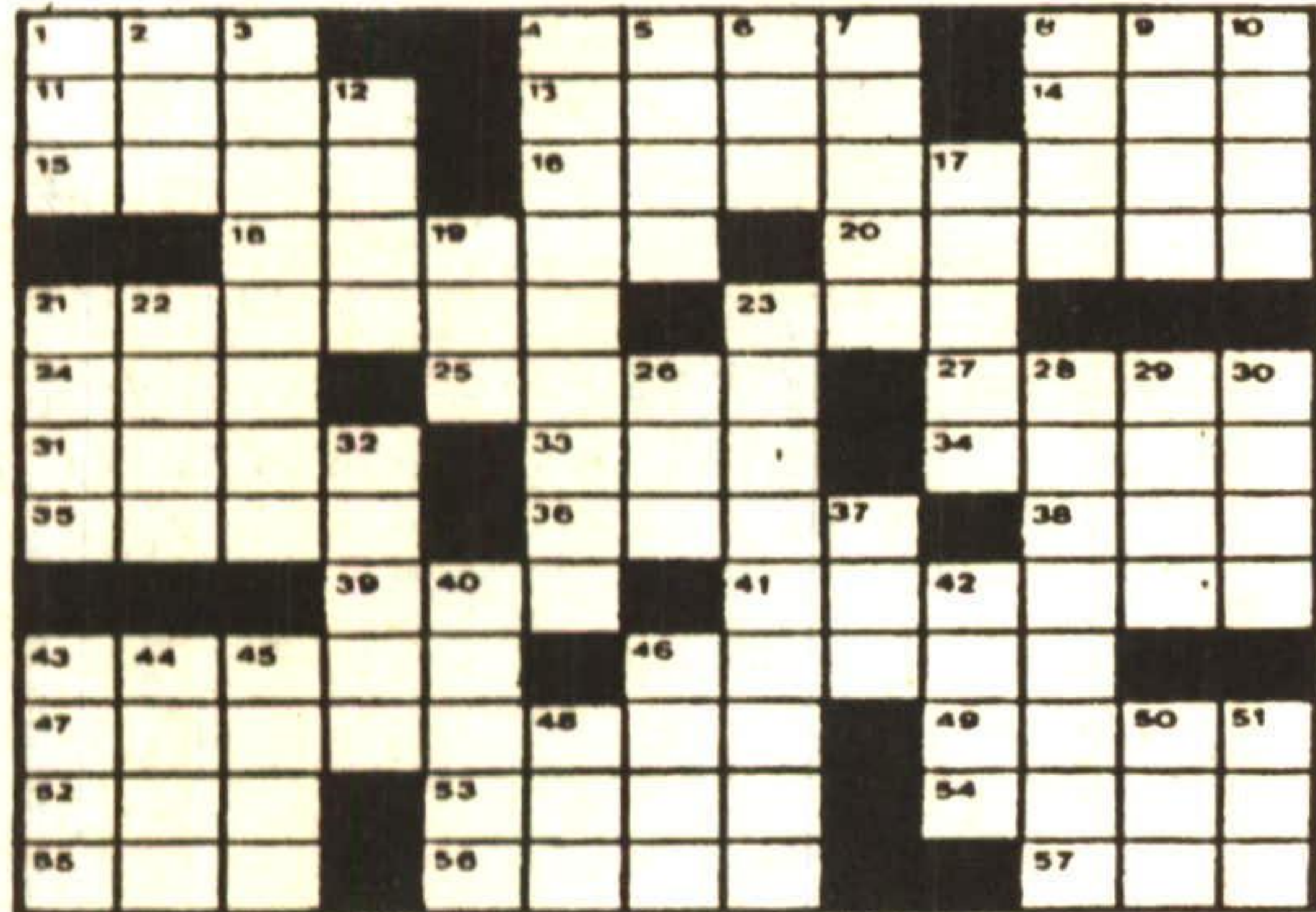

Local rockers St. Xavier got some good news last week, when it was announced that the band's latest release *The Band Plays On*, recorded on Sierra Records, was being released nationwide.

This four track EP contains all new material recorded at the Metalworks Studios in Mississauga. The new songs have already been well received at recent shows and continue to gather support from notable critics, says manager Doug Gray.

Sierra Records, who will promote to radio the title song, feel confident that this new release will do very well, Gray says.

Recorded on cassette and CD, *The Band Plays On* will be available at selected HMV and A and A's stores across the country. Thanks also go to G and S Television, Georgetown; they have also arranged to stock the release, making it easily accessible to local area residents.

As for St. Xavier, whose members include: Dax Urbszat, Russell Gray, Neale Bradley and Andrew Stoddart, many months of hard work are still ahead. The band plans to play as many live shows as possible, and also release video support for the project as soon as possible. Other plans include



instore performances at selected HMV stores and the chance of being considered for the Frostbite Music Festival that takes place in Whitehorse, Yukon. This is for

Canadian performers representing a wide range of musical styles.

Stratford Festival names 1993 playbill

The Stratford Festival announced next season's playbill opening Monday, May 31, 1993.

The playbill consists of three works by William Shakespeare, two musicals, comedies by Molière and Oscar Wilde, a new play by Canadian Sharon Pollock, a Young Company production, a limited return engagement of Dan Needles' acclaimed *Wingfield Trilogy*, six Words and Music concerts and, as previously announced, a production

of Euripides' *Bacchae*.

At the Festival Theatre, opening week productions are: *Antony and Cleopatra*, by William Shakespeare; *A Midsummer Night's Dream*, by William Shakespeare; *Gypsy*, book by Arthur Laurents, music and lyrics by Stephen Sondheim and Jule Styne.

Mid-season production is: *The Imaginary Invalid*, by Molière.

At the Avon Theatre: *The Importance of Being Earnest*, by

Oscar Wilde; *The Mikado*, by Gilbert and Sullivan.

At the Tom Patterson Theatre: *King John*, by William Shakespeare; *Fair Liberty's Call*, by Sharon Pollock; *Euripides' Bacchae*, translation by Kenneth Cavander; *The Wingfield Trilogy*, by Dan Needles; and *A Stratford Festival Young Company production* (to be announced).

The festival continues its '92 performances until November.

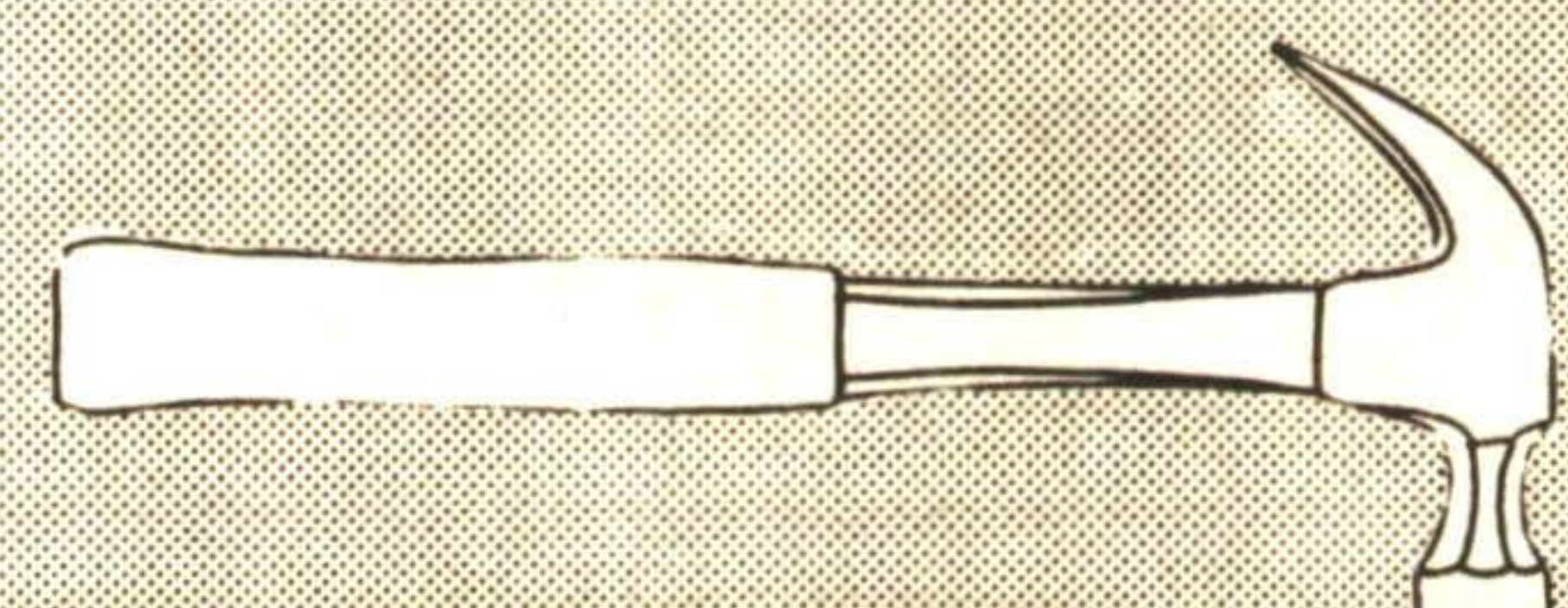
