

Raiders strengthen blueline roster with Hooper

The Georgetown Chrysler Raiders have added some muscle to the blueline corps with the signing of 17-year-old defenceman Colin Hooper earlier this week.

Colin comes to the Raiders from Mississauga, where he played with the local rep. organization last season.

At 6'1" and 195 lbs, Colin brings

size and strength to the local Junior A squad. Georgetown has been in need of another rear guard and young Hooper could be a big plus for the defensive unit.

"He's just a good, strong defenceman who play tough hockey," said Raider President and GM Finn Poulstrup, "He's young and will need to develop, much in same way many of the young defencemen on the team are doing."

No new developments have been



made concerning the Raiders' goaltending situation. With the return of veteran netminder Carmelo Guirleo last week, the Raiders now have

three goalies and are looking to make a trade for a quality defenceman.

Danny Colacito continues to tease the Raiders' coaching staff with constant appearances and disappearances. Colacito, who played with the Raiders last year for a short time before disappearing just before the playoffs, was signed by Georgetown early last month but has failed to show up for recent games and practices.

Colacito has now shown his face at this week's practices and may play in this weekend's games.

Sitting out this weekend will be left winger Dean Doner who suffers from a groin injury. Right winger Jonathan Levack has been having neck problems recently and may not play this weekend either.

The Raiders took on the Oakville Blades Friday night and went against the Mississauga Derbys at Alcott last night (Saturday).

Amateur radio course

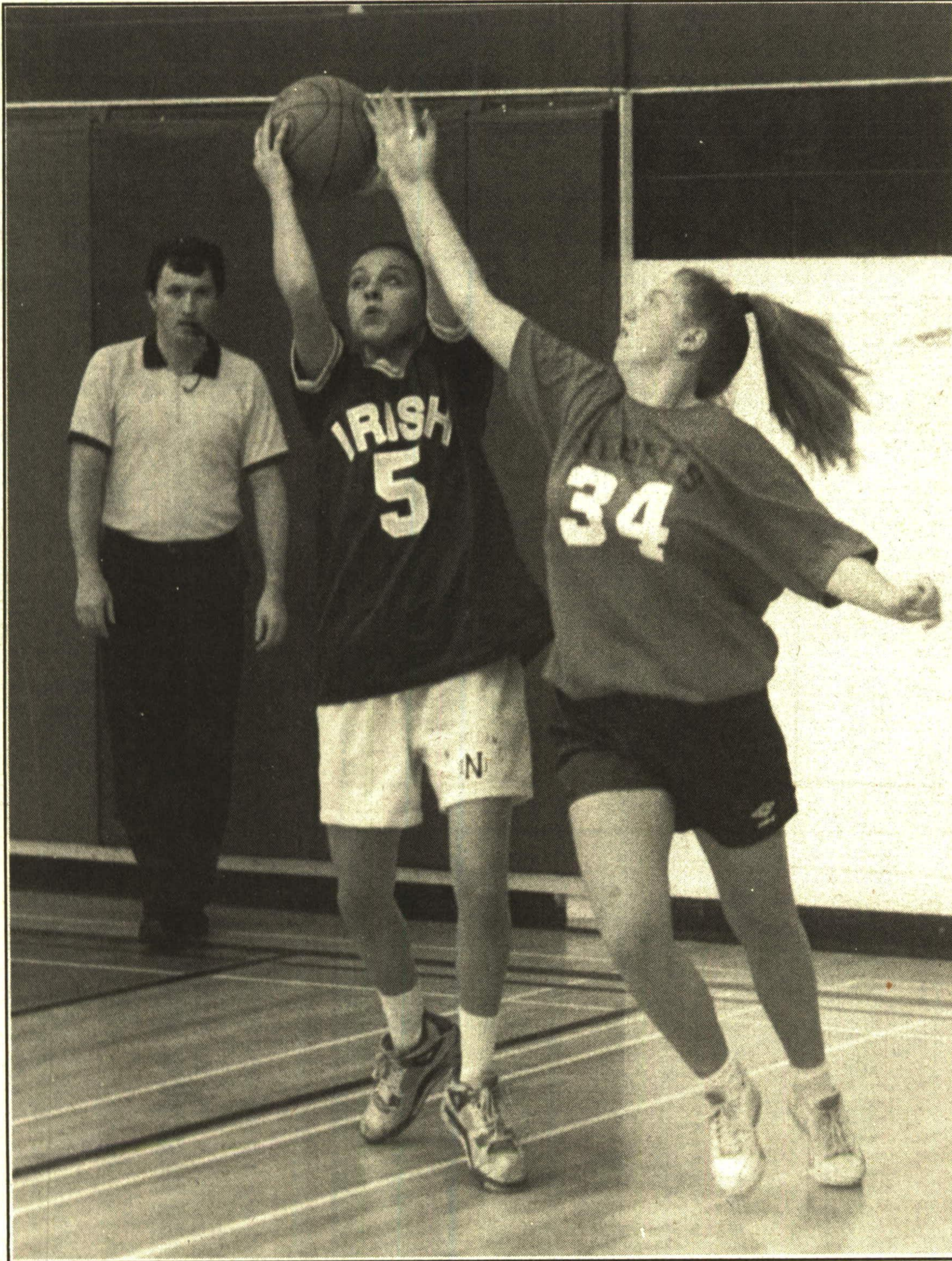
