





Safety tips for women alone; humidifer needed

Nowadays one can not be too careful. Women especially should take extra precautions to be protected and safe while alone. This is the first of a two-part series presenting some tips for women alone from the Halton Regional Police Service.

- Plan your route and avoid short cuts through parks, vacant lots, or unlit areas;

- Do not carry too many packages or a bulky purse;

- Walk near the curb and away from alleys and doorways;

- If you suspect you are being followed, cross the street; go to the nearest home, service station, or open business premises and call the police.

ALERT

If attacked:

- Scream and run to the nearest residence or business. Cries for help can discourage criminals and may result in their arrest;

- If you choose to physically resist, take advantage of any "weapons" you may have - such as a purse or umbrella;

- Note points of identification such as clothing, glasses, scars, hair color and height. Call the




