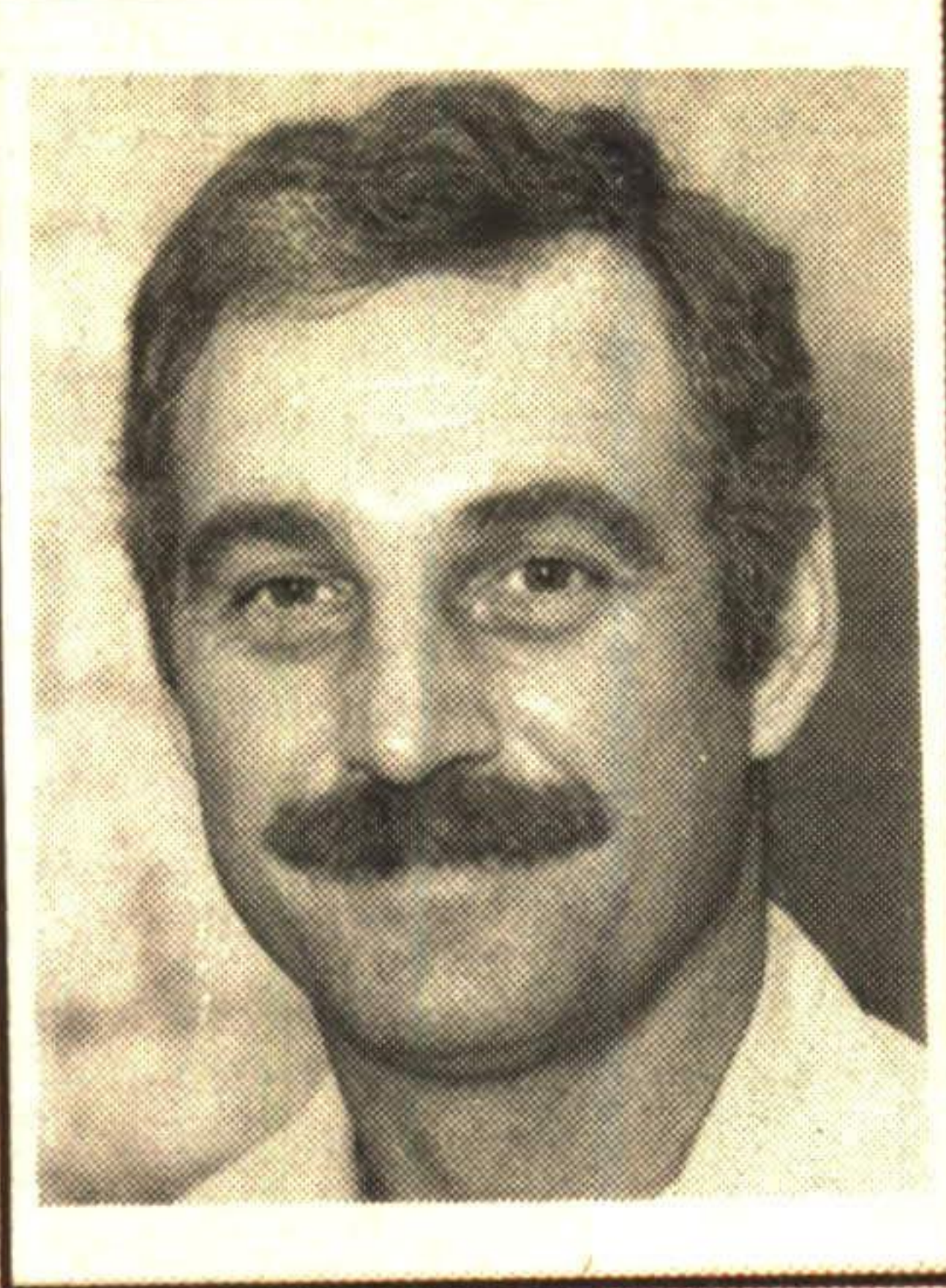

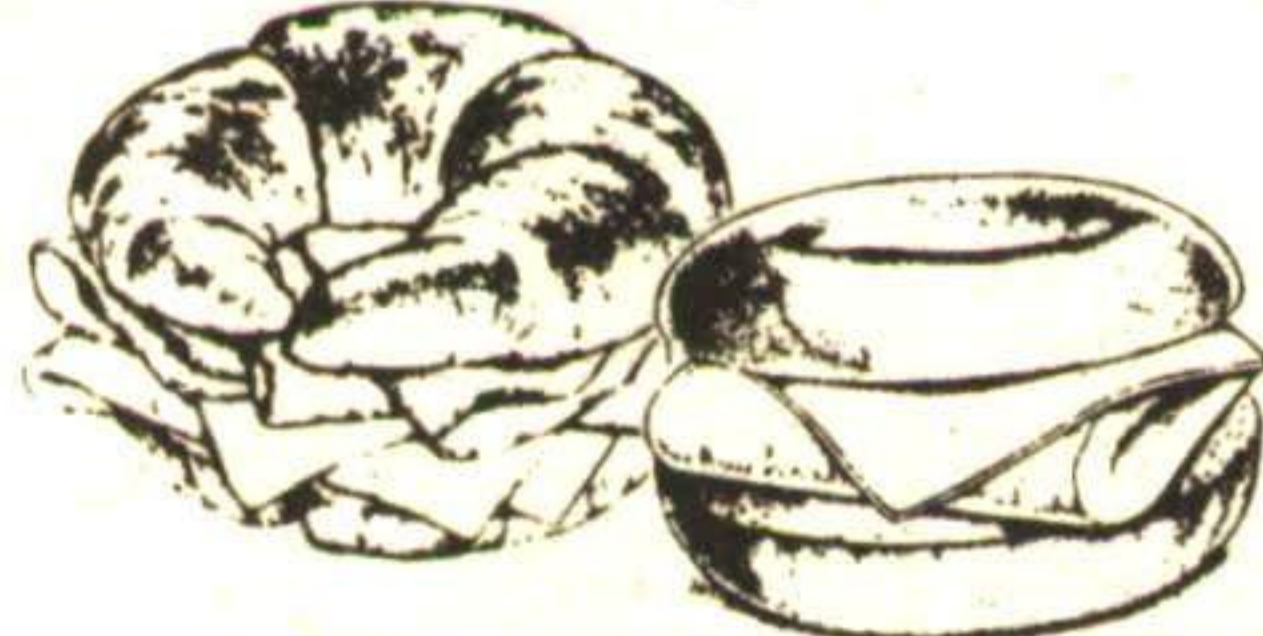

Halton police join Queen's Park protest

About 50 members of the Halton Regional Police Association were among the 6,000 angry officers and citizens who marched on Queen's Park Wednesday to show their discontent with the NDP government's police policies.

Colin Vrooman, president of the Halton Regional Police Association, says most of the Halton participants were police officers, but they were joined by civilian members of the force and some spouses.

The march was a show of support for the Metro police officers who have been involved in a lengthy job action which stemmed from new NDP policies, including the controversial requirement that officers file a report to a third party after they draw their guns.

Since last Monday Halton officers have been sporting blue ribbons in support of the Metro officers and Vrooman says the effort will be expanded in Halton.

"We will be distributing the blue

ribbons to the public," said Vrooman.

The ribbons will be available over the next few days at various locations and times throughout the region including Tim Hortons in Georgetown and Mr. Mugs in Acton. Vrooman could not specify the times.

Association members were at Tim Hortons in Georgetown Thursday morning distributing the ribbons and a fact sheet on their concerns.

Vrooman says those who don't connect with association members at the coffee shops can pick up ribbons at the police station on Guelph St in Georgetown.

"Support from the public has been very good," said Vrooman. "We are having trouble keeping up with the demand for ribbons."

Vrooman says that at this point members of the Halton association are not planning a job action. He says the Halton officers will continue to wear the blue ribbons until the Ontario government rescinds the new police regulations.

Police Blotter

Man charged

Halton police recovered about \$7,500 worth of property stolen from Air Canada during a search of a Georgetown residence Wednesday morning. A 37-year-old male resident of the home has been charged with possession of stolen property. Police say the search was executed as a result of information they had received. Property recovered includes seafood, liquor, perfume, several Nintendo games, milk, computer equipment, watches and jewelry. Police say the accused had been arrested by Peel Regional Police for a theft at the airport on Tuesday.

Car vandalized

Police are investigating a vandalism incident which occurred on 22 Sideroad east of Hwy. 25 in Acton Wednesday night. Police say an Erin Township man was driving his mother's car on 22 Sideroad, stopped and exited the car. Police say the car then slipped into the ditch, and he left the scene to get some help. Police

say when he returned about an hour-and-a-half later he discovered the windshield, driver's window and headlights had been smashed. The hood was dented. Police have set the damage estimate at \$5,000.

Stereo equipment stolen

Police are investigating the theft of about \$5,200 worth of stereo and electronic equipment from a Norval nightclub. Police say the theft occurred sometime between August 15 and Wednesday, Oct. 28.

Witch 'flies away'

Police report that a 5 ft. tall witch was stolen from the front porch of a residence on Willow St. N. in Acton sometime between 1 and 6:30 a.m. Wednesday. The witch, a hand-sewn cloth and nylon Halloween decoration, is valued at \$300.
