

Top athletes honored

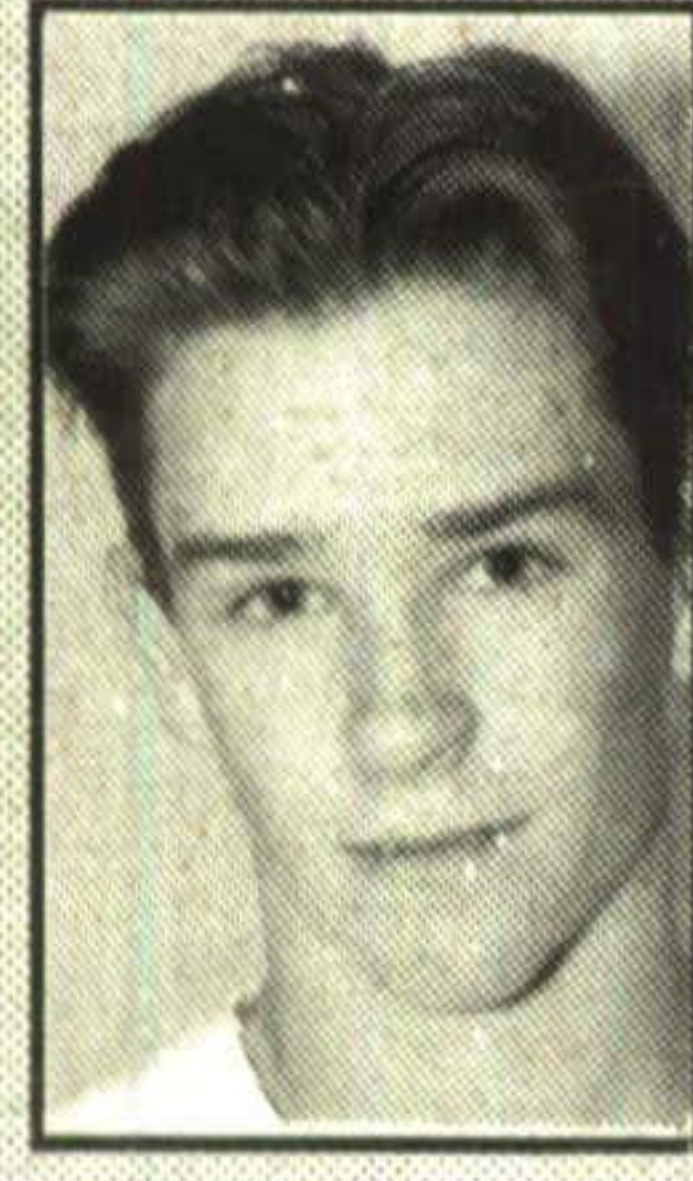


ACTON HIGH SCHOOL

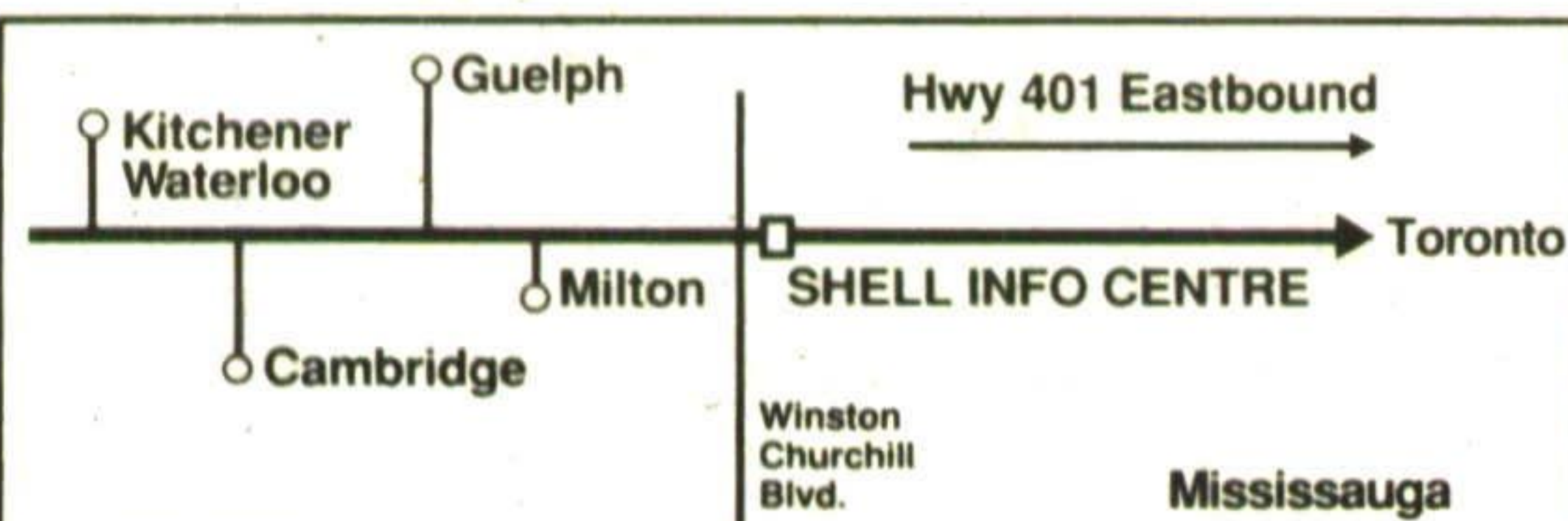
