

### CLASS ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT REGIONAL MUNICIPALITY OF HALTON GEORGETOWN WATER PURIFICATION PLANT UPGRADE

#### PUBLIC INFORMATION SESSION

The Regional Municipality of Halton is in the process of reviewing the Georgetown Water Purification Plant to upgrade this facility to present standards and to implement a program which will allow improved monitoring and control of the water systems.

The study is being conducted in accordance with the planning and design process of Class Environmental Assessments for Municipal Sewage and Water projects. All practical options will be reviewed and evaluated based on their social, environmental and economic impacts.

In compliance with the Environmental Assessment Act, the Regional Municipality of Halton invites all interested parties to attend a Public Information Session in order to review the study program and provide input to the study team.

Regional staff and their Consultant will be available to discuss alternative scenarios and answer questions.
